Margaret Sherrill In the name of God Amen.

I, Margaret Sherrill of the County of Catawba, and State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory, and considering the uncertainty of this life. I therefore make and publish this my last Will and Testament, that in after all my concerns ended and paid, the residue of my estate I give and bequeath and dispose of as follows viz: To my Daughter Susan M. Bridger One (1) bed and bedstead and other appurtenances thereto belonging, One (1) little wheel, One (1) cow, One (1) of my sheep, One (1) of my wearing apparel, One third of my cooking utensils, One (1) set of plates, One set of cups & saucers, and two (2) Dishes, One Sugar bowl, One (1) table, One (1) Chest, three (3) Chairs.

To my Granddaughter Sarah Ann Danner, One (1) room, One (1) large wheel.

To my Daughter M. C. C. Kallman, One bed & bedstead and all the appurtenances thereto belonging, One horse and mule called Pump One (1) third of my sheep, and all my blue delf ware, One third (3) of my wearing apparel, One third of my cooking utensils One (1) trunk, One (1) table, One (1) looking glass, One (1) bed cover One (1) Clock, One (1) Claw Hammer.

To my son Eliza L. Sherrill, One Mare dark bay colored One (1) bed & bedstead and all the appurtenances thereto belonging One writing desk One cradle & cradle, One (1) white heifer and his fathers Bible, and two dollars in silver.

To my son David J. Sherrill One (1) dollar.

To my Grandson Clarence C. Kallman, One (1) Turkey cock. To my Granddaughter Harriett Giden One (1) little wheel.
