In the name of God I Paul Anthony of the county
of Catawba and state of North Carolina being old and
knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die
as I am yet in sound mind and memory blessed be
God for his mercy and think proper to make this my last will
and Testament I do hereby make and publish this my
last Will and Testament in the following manner and
form first I recommend my immortal soul into the
hands of Almighty God who gave it and my body to the
earth to be buried in a decent christian manner and the
expense thereof to be paid out of my estate and that
all my lawful debts shall be paid out of my estate.

First I give unto my beloved wife Magdalene two hundred
and fifty dollars silver coins two & four logs two sheep
to take choice out of my stock I give her Draper
and two beds and steeds with furniture likewise
all the kitchen furniture & cupboard and the spring
house stable for her cows & sheep and the third
of the garden and the right of the Dwelling house
as long as she bears my name as a widow

Second - I give and bequeath unto oldest son Philip
the following property first a plantation called the Run place
two hundred & four acres worth 2300
also another piece joining of three acres worth 36
I also give him two negroes first a boy named Lumpire
about twenty three years old worth 1000

the other a woman named Glory about thirty yrs 300
I give him a horse called Taylor about six years 100
I give him a Cow and Calf 10
I give him a bed & stead worth 8

Third - I give and bequeath unto my second son
Cyrus Paul the following property
1 I first give him two thousand Dollars to pay for his land
2 I give him three negroes first a woman named Nancy
about fifty years old worth 200

3 I give him a boy named Dick about fourteen years old worth 600
4 I give him another boy named Eli about ten years old worth 400
5 I give him a bed worth 12
6 I give him two mules one named Jack the other
named Jo and the gear worth & a bed 15-0
this is the amount when he moved to Georgia

Fourth - I give and bequeath unto my third son Abel Henry Five wagons 1 A boy named Joseph about twelve years old worth 400

2 I give him A boy ten years old named Williams 300

3 I give him a woman fifteen years old named Sarah 600

4 I give him a girl eight years old named Rishworth 340

5 I give him a girl ten years old named Francesworth 500

6 I also give him 1 blind horse named Sam worth 15

7 the other a mare named Sall worth 40

8 I give him a set of hind gears and bridles worth 08

9 I also give him by his agent Cephas P. Anthony 400

11 I also give him in cash in December 27 A.D. 1858 314

11 I also give him a new wagon worth 100

12 I also give him a bay mare named Glory worth 25

13 I also give him a bed worth 12

Fifteenth - I now give and bequeath unto fourth son
Braham 1 A plantation called the Daniel Anthony
place two hundred acres joining the home place worth 1300

2 I give him a tract of fine land joining my fine land
called the Low land eighty acres worth 70

3 I also give him another piece out of a tract called the
Smith land one hundred acres on the south side worth 1000

4 I also give him a negro boy twenty three years old named
Kash 15 worth 1000

5 I also give him a negro girl thirteen years old named
Isabel worth 100

6 I also give him a mule named Bob six years old 120

7 I also give him a bed worth 15

8 I also give him a cow worth 12

Sixth - I now will and bequeath unto my fifth
son Jacob 1 I give him the plantation which I now
lie and two pieces joining that I got of Anthony Steel makes
two hundred and 887 acres worth 2500

2 I also give him another piece out of the Smith
joining the home tract one hundred acres 1000

3 I also give him another tract of fine land
called the Low lands one hundred acres worth 100

4 I also give him a negro man named Steven about
forty years old worth 500

5 I also give him another black man named Bain & forty
years old worth 800

6 I also give him a negro woman named Anna
forty two years old he must let the widow have her

when she wants her to wait on her after her death
to be his and the increase of her

7 I give him two mules 1 named Bill 2 named Mike and
two wagons and the gears and floors and harness and
all the farming tools and blacksmith shop and tools and
the carriage & gears I now give him chest bureau press and
Drauer up stairs and bats belonging to the house for
my maintenance and the widow the property not valued to
be his

I now will and bequeath to my oldest daughter
Elizabeth Salina the following property

1 A piece of bottom land I bought of the widow Probst
called the angel bottom Twenty seven acres worth 750

2 I give her a piece of fine land called the Roads land
two hundred acres worth 220

3 another piece of fine land joining the Roads land
about ninety acres called the Souts tract is worth 90

4 I give her a negro woman and child named Jane
about nineteen years old worth 1000

5 I give her a negro boy about eight years 600

6 I give her a negro girl about ten years old
named Grace worth 600

7 I give her house furniture a drawer table beds
and kitchen furniture worth 11 400²⁴

I now will and bequeath to my youngest daughter
Any Mary the following property

1 I give her a Plantation called the Hartcock place
on the west side of the south fork

One hundred and forty eight acres worth 1500 - ✓

2 I also give her piece of fine land lying on hog
Hill called the Hartcock lands one hundred
and twenty acres joining the Hedges place - 220

3 I also give her another piece of fine land lying
on the east side of hog hill called the Hartcock land
about seventy acres worth - 70

4 I also give her a negro girl named Chain about seventeen years
old worth 600

5 I also give her a negro boy named churchill
about eleven years old worth 600

6 I also give her house furniture to be worth
a drawer 2 beds a table and chairs and
kitchen furniture

I now direct and command that my son Jacob shall furnish my beloved wife with a sufficient dwelling house so that she may be satisfied and where she may choose it he shall likewise furnish her at all times with horse saddle and bridle when she demands it of him also yearly with ten bushels of good wheat twenty bushels of corn and twenty lbs of cotton picked and hundred and fifty pounds of pork twenty pounds of sugar ten pounds of coffee he shall likewise feed her creatures sufficiently of his own feed he shall also provide for her all and every thing that she may needs ask of him so that it may accurem necessary for her use that to say salt spice spirits and fire wood spinning wheel and cards and a girl to wait on her.

The property willed belongs to her so long as remains my widow otherwise its falls to my estate and is to be equally divided amongst them heirs.

Now the property belong to me not willed any execulor shall make publick sale among the heirs and the highest bidder shall be the purchaser and the amount thereof shall be divided amongst the heirs to have equal shares of all the property except Abel Henry is to have Five hundred Dollars more than the rest for the sake of his eye that he lost in my care.

I now appoint ordain and empower my two sons Abraham and Jacob as my Execulors of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all former wills made by me In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 20 of March In the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty one Signed sealed and delivered by the Paul Anthony above named Paul Anthony to be his last will and Testament of us who have hereunto subscribed our names as witnesses in the presence of the testator
