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I, Peter Warlick of the County of Catawba and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of earthly existence do make and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner & form following that is to say first after my death as to the plantation where I now live on my Will is to leave it to the choice of my wife and children whether or not they will have it sold or divided first giving my wife Catharine one third of value of said land that is in case they agree to divide said place but in case they agree to sell said place then in that case my wife to have after my Executor provides for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my friends and relations and pay all funeral expenses together with my just debts owing out of the money that may first come into his hands as a part or parcel of my estate after that is done then my wife to have one third of the residue or proceeds that is in case they agree to sell said plantation and it is my will for my daughter Sallie to have one hundred dollars more than my other two daughters namely Harriet Potin & Margaret Rousaur, that is of the balance of proceeds my will is if they agree to sell the land to sell my personal property also first giving my wife two beds and all my house hold and kitchen furniture to dispose of at her will the balance of proceeds of personal property to be equally divided between my three daughters Margaret, Harriett & Sally. Lastly my will is in case they divide my land after do over out for my daughter Sally to have one hundred dollars more in valuation than my other two daughters that is Margaret Rousaur & Harriet Potin and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my trusty friend Jacob Mosteller, my lawful Executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last Will and Testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof.
