Farny Executor of the last will and testament of Nathaniel Wilson Esq. which original goes to his wife during her natural life and after her death to my daughter Anna is living said negro is left to remain in her possession in my plantation where he now is upon the purpose of helping her in the raising and taking care of the two youngest children that are bound to her as indentured in my will come to full age of eighteen years and after the death of my wife and also after the two youngest children are older to come to the age of eighteen years then said negro is to be sold in a reasonable price of my executor and the money arising from said sale to be divided in the same way as the other money of my estate are directed to be divided of my will I'm witness whereof I the said Daniel Fingar have caused to set my hand and affixed my seal this 10th day of June 1851

115 In the name of God aman I Philip Sudwill of the State of North Carolina and of the County of Estrella being weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be to God but knowing in mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make this my last will and testament that is to say first of all I give and bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my Executor nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I will arise the same again by the mighty power of God and as it has pleased almighty God to bless me with some wholly stated give and dispose of the same in the following manner and form

First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth during her natural life one negro girl named Adeline about fifteen years old also one horse best first choice of all my horses two first choice head of cattle also one year's support out of the stock except provisions at hand for my said wife and family including my son Philip G. Sudwill to be allotted by my Executor herein after named also give unto him all of his furniture that she brought her of every kind I also will and bequeath to my said wife during her natural life and my son Philip G. Sudwill my Plantation I now live on for them to live together and occupy my house as one family at the death of my wife Elizabeth my said Plantation I will leave bequeath to be equally divided between my son in law Adelie God and my son Philip G. Sudwill to be equally divided to them and their lawful heirs forever I also will and bequeath to my son Philip G. one negro boy his choice out of my negroes on hand also we have his share after his step mother also my negroes two lots giving my said son in law Adelie one lot in two bushels place also my barn capacious & containing one hundred & three

Second I give and bequeath unto my son in law Adelie G. God and wife Adelia all the property charged in my account book in his possession Item I give and bequeath unto my son in law Adelie G. God & wife Adelia all the property charged in my account book which is also in these premises

Item I give and bequeath unto Adelie G. Sudwill all the property charged in my account book also in these premises

Item I give and bequeath unto Anna Farny child who is my grand child one hundred dollars to be paid by my Executor when she becomes of age

Item I will and bequeath that my Executor herein after named at my decease sell at public sale all the remainder of my property and the personalty with my money not to exceed up to the sum of

First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth during her natural life one negro boy named Eddie about fifteen years old also one horse beast first choice of all my horses two first choice hounds of battle also one years support out of the stock crop & provisions in hand for my said wife and family including my son Philip Huddill to be allotted by my executors herein after named also give unto him all of his furniture that she brought her of every kind I also will and bequeath to my said wife during her natural life and my son Philip & his wife Mary Huddill my Plantation & house thereon for them to live together and occupy my house as one family & at the death of my wife Elizabeth my said Plantation & will and bequeath to be equally divided between my son in law Eddie God and my son Philip Huddill to be equally divided to them and their lawful heirs forever I also will & bequeath to my son Philip & one negro boy his choice out of my negroes on hand also we have his choice after his wife Mary also my negro girl two sets young my wind shift one horse one two horse plow also my team of bullock & cart one Brandy & block

Item I give and bequeath unto my son in law Eli G. Dial and wife Maria all the property charged in my account book in his possession Item I give and bequeath unto my son in law Ezekiel Dial & wife Fanny all the property charged in my account book which is also in their possession

Item I give and bequeath unto Marcus H. Huddill all the property charged in my account books also in these premises

Item I give and bequeath unto Anne Potts child who is my grand child one hundred dollars to be paid of my executors when I become of age

Item I will and bequeath that my greater heirs after named at my decease sell at public sale all the remainder of my estate and the proceeds with my money notes and effects of every
