Daniel Fingie son of the County of Cumberland and State of North Carolina has made my last will and Testament in writing being dated 3<sup>rd</sup> day of March AD 1857 but since that time the situation of my estate is materially altered and so by this my writing which I declare to be a Codicil to my said last will and Testament and to be taken as a part of it and to hereby further give to my beloved wife Elizabeth Fingie my negro man Isaac which I lately purchased of Nathaniel Wilson executor of the last will and Testament of Nathaniel Wilson and which negro I give to her my said wife during her natural life and after her death provided my daughter Hannah is living said negro is still to remain in her possession on my plantation when he is or is for the purpose of helping her in the raising and taking care of the two orphan children that are bound to me as mentioned in my will come to full age of eighteen years and after the death of my wife and also after the two orphan children shall be dead to come to the age of eighteen years then said negro shall be sold in a reasonable price of my executor and the money arising from said sale to be divided in the same way as the other money of my estate as directed to be divided by my will In witness whereof & the said Daniel Fingie has hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 10<sup>th</sup> day of June AD 1857

First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth during her natural life one negro girl named Adeline about fifteen years old also one horse best first choice of all my horses two first choice head of cattle also one year's support out of the stock crop & provisions on hand for my said wife and family including my son Philip & Hurdissill to be allotted by my executor hereafter named also give unto her all of her furniture that she brought her of every kind I also will and bequeath to my said wife during her natural life and my son Philip & Hurdissill my plantation I give her on for them to live together and occupy my house as one family & at the death of my wife Elizabeth my said plantation I will once bequeath to be equally divided between my son in law Eli G. Deal and my son Philip & Hurdissill to be equally divided to them and their lawful heirs forever I also will & bequeath to my son Philip & Hurdissill one negro boy his choice out of my negroes on hand also one horse his choice after his step mother also my negroes two sets giving my son Deal one horse and two horse place also my team hupboard & constant one plow and 4 blocks

Then I give and bequeath unto my son in law Eli G. Deal and wife Eliza all the property charged in my account book in this life previous

Then I give and bequeath unto my son in law Deal & Deal's wife Eliza all the property charged in my account book which is also in three possession

Rudisill to be equally divided to them and their lawful heirs forever I also will & bequeath to my son Philip C. one negro boy his choice out of my negroes on hand also one horse his choice after his ship mother also my naggon & two sleds giving my son Eli C. Deal one horse one two base place also my brown cupboard & content one Brause & clock

Then I give and bequeath unto my son in law Eli C. Deal and wife Eliza all the property charged in my account book in his possession  
+ Then I give and bequeath unto my son in law Jacob Deal & wife Fanny all the property charged in my account book which is also in their possession

Then I give and bequeath unto Harous H. Rudisill all the property charged in my account book also in their possession  
Then I give and bequeath unto Isaac Brantle Child who is my second child one hundred dollars to be paid by my executor when I become of age
