In the name of God, Amen. I Joseph Brown of the County of Catawba and State of North Carolina being weak in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory, do make who publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following, that is to say. First, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Catherine Brown one cupboard and furniture one bed and Burreau the one she bought with her three beds and furniture. I also will that my wife Catherine Brown divide out a bed each to my two eldest sons Franklin and Thompson when they shall be old for them I will to my wife Catherine Brown one Room and bedchamber and my daughter Alice to have the use of the Room while they shall be together. I also will that my wife Catherine Brown have one side table, one Wash pit, and Kitchen Furniture. In Mites, Corn, parched corn, six head of Sheep, one Horse and Negro girl named Anna to belong to my wife Catherine Brown during her life, but the inheritance of the Negro girl Anna if any she should have to be sold and divided amongst the wife when my youngest son Andrew Elbert Brown shall become of age, I also will that the Negro girl Anna belong to the use of the family until my youngest son Andrew Elbert Brown shall become of age. It is to belong to my wife Catherine Brown, but her increase, to be sold of any she should have as stated above, and equally divided amongst my heirs, my wife one with the rest. Second, I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Jones one Side Saddle and one Warre, this she to live and bequeath to my daughter Eleanore Brown one wheel and bridle, one Bridle and saddle one Burreau and Bedstead, bed and furniture her own bedstead one Saddle blanket, one Cow and Calf, when she needs it, and fifty dollars in money, as soon as executor can make sale and collect.

Thirdly, I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Brown, one wheel and Cards one Bridle, Saddle, and Blancket, one Burreau to be bought for Mary, one bedstead, bed, and furniture, the bedstead her own, one Cow and Calf, when needed, and fifty dollars in money, as soon as my Executor can make sale and collect.

Fifthly, I give and bequeath to my Son William T. Brown, the sum of thirty five dollars in money as soon as my Executor can make sale and collect. Sixthly, I give and bequeath to my Son Thompson Brown one horse, Saddle and Bridle at a fair valuation and the balance in money to make him out one hundred dollars as soon as my Executor can make sale and collect. Seventhly, I give and bequeath to my Sons Leman Conrad Brown James, Elmore Brown and Andrew Elbert Brown that after the payment of my just debts, the remainder of the proceeds of the sale of my property be equally divided amongst my three youngest Sons. I also will one Negro boy named Calvin be left to make for the support of my family, as long as he may stay together or until my youngest child shall become of age, and under the entire control of my

Brother Gabriel Brown until my youngest child shall become of age, then to be sold with the Negro boy. Same in case of any she should have the proceeds of the sale of the Negro boy, but in like manner divided amongst my heirs. My wife one with the rest. I also will that my executor sell a tract of land of mine, lying on the White road in the County and State aforesaid containing one hundred acres, more or less, adjoining Lands of Michael Setton, David Fisher and others. I also will that my executor sell the above mentioned land public or private as he may think best.

I also will that the proceeds of the sale of the land go to the payment of my lawful debts and the balance of any to be divided amongst my heirs Andrew Brown, Mary Brown, Elizabeth Brown, Thompson Brown and my three youngest Sons, equally. I also will six head of Hogs to the use of my family. Ingratiate to mention in the proper place that I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Catherine Brown, one Bridle and blanket, wheel and cards.

I nominate, constitute and appoint my beloved wife Catherine Brown and my brother Gabriel Brown, sole executors of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me at any time made in writing or otherwise. I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the 6th day of April in the year of our Lord A.D. 1847. — Signed Sealed published and declared by the above named Joseph Brown to be his last will and testament, in the presence of us,

In the name of God Amen. I Sherrill of the County of Catawba, and State of North Carolina being advanced in age but of sound mind and memory and calling to mind that I have to day, do publish this to be my last will and testament in manner and form as follows. Viz. to say, I do act and bequeath to my Son Gabriel A. Sherrill all my money, securities consisting of notes, bonds, other papers or drafts, of any description due me, all my stock of every description, all my house hold and Kitchen furniture including Cars and all other things personal about a house, all Meat, all crops, grain stored or growing, including the rent of my land, also, the use, or hire of a certain Negro man named Charles Brown for my lifetime or Midwinter by my trust and Alexander Sherrill, late of the County of Lincoln and State aforesaid, who to my Son Gabriel A. Sherrill sold some time since to Ruben Sherrill which I believe the service of, and will and bequeath the hire, use and service of said negro to my Son Gabriel A. Sherrill with all other legacies and articles matters and things as are above mentioned. Just in as full a manner as if repeated again and all other things mentioned or not mentioned belonging to me.

I further give and bequeath to her the little and hind gears, Hoss and reaps, and Coopers Woods, Fifty bushels of corn, thirty bushels of wheat, one more her choice, three cows and one heifer her choice, the blue Sow and pigs, three colt hogs, her choice Four Beds and bedsteads, her choice, sarcans and blocks, Scorn, and every thing belonging to it, one little spinning wheel and the big spinning wheel, one plow, and gearing for the same, Singletree and blaris, one wash pot, and tubs, all the kitchen furniture two drapery and any thing there on, the bread tray and bread box, three bushels of Yull, Thirty pounds of coffee, and fifteen pounds of sugar, Two Rockers, Six Chairs and the tortoise of glass, Six milk Crocks, two Jugs, two pitchers, two bottles, all the modern bowls, two buckets, all the Bacon and lard on hand, all the fruit on the home place, Flour, enough to do till next harvest, and fodder and oats, enough to till just fall, for her more as much oats as she wishes to sow, one acre and Mullock, three horses, all the potatoes and cabbage, all the Cotton and flax, Four bags, the few huckle, Twenty gallons of whiskey, two ewe sheep, two Smoothing Irons, and the little Stylars, The above mentioned property, she is to have, and to hold during her life, and in widowhood, but in case she should marry, all the property except the land shall be sold at public sale, and the money shall be equally divided among the heirs, with whom she shall have equally. After her death, the land also, shall be sold, and the money divided equally among the heirs.

Secondly I give and bequeath to my Son Abel one hundred acres of land at a valuation of One dollars an acre, to be paid off at the Contrafction end of the tract, by a straight line to be run from William Squires line to Jacob Hunsuckers line he shall not sell the land till after the death of the widow, And should the above valuation be more than what will make this share equal to the others, he shall after the

the decease of the widow, pay the other heirs till all will be equal. — Secondly tract of Land in Iredell County, is to be rented, to the highest bidder, for the present year, and the rent to be paid in Corn, after which the said tract, shall be sold at public sale, and the money shall equally be divided among the children, as soon as collected, all the balance of the land under cultivation, is to be rented annually, and the rent sold at public sale, and the money loaned on interest, and after the death of the widow, the land is to be sold to the highest bidder, and the money equally divided among the heirs.

All the balance of the property shall be sold at public sale, and after all my debts are paid the money shall go to those children that are not charged or never got any thing from home, until they get any equal share with the rest. The balance is to be equally divided among all the heirs, I wish my executor to act as agent for my wife, and her family, in renting, and Contracting, Selling, and collecting so long as he shall see proper to do so, and if which to resign his agency, the Court shall appoint another in his stead.

And I hereby make and ordain my worthy friend Daniel Miller Executor of this my last will and testament, in witness whereof I the said Joseph Bonhauer, have this my last will and testament set my hand and seal, the day and above written.
