Know all men by these presents that I Robert B.B. Houston,
of the County of Catawba and State of North Carolina,
being of sound mind and judgment in view of the
constant uncertainty of human life, do hereby
make and declare this to be my Last Will and
Testament as follows viz:
I give bequeath and devise to my beloved wife
Virginia F. L. Houston my half interest right
and title in and to a lot and stone house
in and to a dwelling house now occupied by
J. H. Houston situated in the Town of Catawba
also my half interest in a lot back of the
residence of Mr. Laurence Eg and my half
interest in a shoe shop in the course of election
in the Town of Catawba to her and her
heirs, Executors, Administrators and assigns
forever.
I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Virginia F. L.
Houston my half interest in a stock of goods of
the firm of A. H. & R. B. B. Houston - to her her Executors
Administrators and assigns forever.
I give and bequeath all my individual notes, accounts,
wines and library to my beloved wife Virginia F.
L. Houston. Also all my right title and interests in
in the old firm of my brothers.
In few words I give all my property and estate real
and personal to my beloved wife Virginia F. L.
Houston - to her and her heirs. Executors and Adminis-
trators and assigns forever.
I hereby revoke and declare null and void
all former Wills and Testaments made by me,
and declare this to be my last will and testament
done this the 11th Jan 1878.
