

Test Will and Testament of Salina Bolick
Catawba County, N.C. Apr. 1883.

I, Salina Bolick, citizen of said state and County, considering the uncertainty of human life, and wishing to dispose of my earthly substance, and being of sound mind and memory, do ordain appoint the following as my last will and testament to wit:

1 I will and bequeath to my beloved daughter, Salina Elvina Punch, wife of Joseph Leung Lou Punch, to her and her and her heirs, the land on which I and they now live consisting of twenty-seven acres more or less adjoining lands of Joel Simmons, Gerald Bolick and others.

2 It is my will that the said S.E. Punch, together with her husband, J. L. Punch and heirs, furnish me during my natural life, decently and sufficiently with the necessities of life and pay all expenses incurred by sickness burial or otherwise, and in case this provision of No 2 is not complied with, No 1 of this will shall be null and void.

3. Furthermore, it is my will that my beloved daughter, Lena Caroline Bolick, receive a decent and sufficient maintenance out of the proceeds of said land and that all expenses, incurred by her sickness or otherwise, be paid by said S.E. Punch, her husband or heirs, and in case this provision No 3. is not complied with, the provision No 1. to be null and void.

Made this the third day of April in the year of our Lord 1883.

attesting witness thereto, as aforesaid, the

a will, and was not under any restraint
to the knowledge, information or belief of
this deponent and further these deponents say
not.
