and Testament that my beloved brother-in-law  
Nelson Huffman & sister Rhoda Huffman

and furnish me with a decent burial  
after my death and pay the same out  
of the money or property which shall  
remain after my death.

Item fourth. It is my last Will  
and Testament that my beloved brother-in-law  
Nelson Huffman & sister Rhoda  
Huffman shall have possession of all  
my property & money after my death, to  
do with it what they please without  
petitioning to Court to make sale.
