I, Sidney Fish, of the County of Ottawa and State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory, and considering the uncertainty of this frail and transitory life do therefore make, ordain, publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament; that is to say: First after all my lawful debts are paid and discharged, the residue of my estate real and personal, I give, bequeath and dispose of as follows. To my wife the plantation and appurtenances situated thereon lying in the State and County aforesaid joining Washington, C. H. Swan, Exa Bridges and others, and all my personal property, notes and accounts and money that may be found at my decease. To have and to hold during the term of her natural life or widowhood; and after her death or marriage to be divided equally among my heirs viz: D. S. Josephine, L. F. Gerald, M. H. Fidelia, J. F. Julia,
In case that any of the heirs herein named, should die before the death or marriage of my wife the surviving heirs shall share and share alike.
Likewise I make, constitute and appoint G. S. Bridges to be executor of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me made.

In witness whereof, I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal, the sixth 6th day of November in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy six 1876.

James, all my property, notes, money & effects, bed apparel and jewels and all my effects of what ever kind, to have and to hold forever, 3rd I hereby constitute my beloved son William G. James, my executor to execute this my last Will and Testament and hereby revoking, making null and void all other Wills heretofore made by me.
