## LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF A. J. CALDWELL.

I, A. J. Caldwell of the County of Coatemba and State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence ide make and declare this my last will and testument in manner and form following that is to say: --

FIRST: -- That my executor (hereinafter named) shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relations and friends and pay all funeral empenses together with my just debts howsonver and whomsonver owing, out of the moneys that may first some into his hands as a part or parcel of my estate:

ITEM 1: - I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah Caldwell and all no real estate and personal property belonging to me at the time of my death, but he here during her natural lifetime.

ITEM 2:-- I give and bequeath to Rebecca Caldwell the lot or parcel of land, known as the Island and another tract or pascel of land adjoining the lands of JAson Sherrill and others, which is bounded as follows: --
