Carolina & County of Lenoir being weak in body but of a sound
perfect mind & memory do make & Publish this my last will &
Testament in and form following that is to say
First I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Army Whitener my
house and lot here & all furniture therein during her life and after
decease to be divided between my daughter Blanchina Delinger and
Marie Mayle & Michael Whitener also all my live stock to be divided
my wife Army and Blanchina Marie & Michael; all my land &
Plantations with all the buildings thereon I give and bequeath
unto the above named Michael Whitener all my debts & claims
and my wind mill; or fees all due by note or book accounts &
also due unto my son Michael Whitener I will my by work put
out all right and principle of the Garden to Army my wife
I will my big english Bible to my grandaughter Martha Monroe Whitener
all my books to be divided between my grand sons namely Michael
Sams I do hereby appoint the above named Michael Whitener my
sole executor of this my last will & Testament in witness
I have hereunto set my hand & seal this thirty first day of March 1864

the above named David Whitener to be his
last will & testament in the presence of us
who have hereunto subscribed our names as
witnesses in the presence of the Testator

The last will & Testament of Thompson Brown of the State of N.C.
and in the County of Catawba I Thompson Brown Considering the uncertainty of this mortal life & being of sound mind memory & memory to make and publish this my last will & Testament in manner & form following that is to say
First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary A Brown
+ and my two sons Henry Goldman & Edward Bruce Brown all of my
property that I now have in my possession namely one Cultivate or
sow and its contents and three head and bedding + one barrow and
chariots + one Rifle gun + Shotpouch and one horse + one horse Wagon
+ one buggy and all my cooking utensils belonging to kitchen affairs
+ five head of hogs + one huffer calf that has got nearly bin and is at
this time at the Absalom Stokes and three or more head of sheep
+ one set of Blacksmith tools consisting of bellows and anvil +
Vice one sledge an two hand hammers horse shaving tools and all
other tools belonging to them and all my farming tools Axes &c
and one chest + contents and one trunk + eight chairs and two
tables and one small water Sable + one grind Stone + one scythe
+ Cradle and one Dutch mowing scythe + 4 argers handsaw +
Drawing knife &c. and also all my interest of negroes belonging
to the estate of Joseph Brown deceased and if all other property that
may be + still remains my property belonging to my beloved wife
+ I do give all other property of Personal estate goods + chattels
of what kind + nature soever this may be now all the above named
articles of goods + chattels, I give + bequeath to my beloved wife to have
as long as she lives + at her death these said articles of goods and
chattels shall be sold and equally divided between my two sons
Henry Goldman Brown + Edward Bruce Brown an time and space
of six months now all this that be executed if I Thompson Brown
shall happen to return from the army or be dead of no more also
I will + bequeath to my wife and two sons one lot + lot on the back
Creek Campground now all the above named articles goods and
chattels is to belong to my wife Mary A Brown to be hers as long as
she lives + then it shall be sold + equally divided between the above
named two sons in the time + space of six months Thompson Brown
the above instrument consisting one sheet or two sheets was now here
subscribed by I Brown the testator in the presence of each of us and was
at the same time declared by him to be his last will + Testament and we
at his request sign our names here as attesting witnesses and Thompson
Brown do leave Mr. Judge A. Sherrill to be the executor of this above instru-
ment of writing this being 31st day of March in the year of our Lord 1862
