In the Name of God, Amen. I, Wm. S. Littell, citizen of the County of Catawba, and State of North Carolina, being of sound and perfect Mind and Memory, blessed be God, do This twenty-eighth day of October, in the Year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty five. Do make and ordain, this my last will and Testament, in manner following, that is to say, That I have given Samuel Sillito, Ann Sherrill, Margaret Littell, and Hogan Littell their full Share of my estate, &c. I give to my daughter Margaret Littell the sum of Four Hundred dollars, and also my bed and furniture, and my Trunk.

2nd. I Give to Samuel Littell, his last the sum of Sixty three dollars, two notes that I have on William Littell, and wherar - will land for that amount.

3rd. I Give to my two grand children Rosanna and Bentley, my son Hogan's Children one Cow and Calf, and all the rest of my loose property, that I have on Hand except a box of Carpenter Tools that Bentley is to have, without any divide with his Sister - And I hereby make and ordain my worthy friend Gabriel Brown executor of this my last will and Testament, and revoking all Wills heretofore by me made. In witness whereof I the said Wm. Littell to this my last will and Testament set my hand and seal, the day and year above written.

In the Name of God, Amen. I, John Robinson of the County Catawba and State of North Carolina, now weak of body and strengthened but of perfect feet, and sound mind and memory, blessed be God, and - calling to mind my mortality, do make constitute, and ordain this my last will and Testament, byz. My soul I resign to the powers a bove, from whence it came, and my body, I request, that it shall be decently put into the earth, after my death. And as to what mortaly property, God in his providence has been pleased to inow me with, I will and bequeath it as follows: I will and bequeath to my dearly beloved wife, Jane Robinson the whole use of my plantation whereon I now live containing Five Hundred and eight acres more or less, during her natural life and the property of every kind, which same possesed of, at my death after paying off my debts to the Burthen, charges, and honest debts. And after her death I order that the plantation whereon I now live, shall be equally divided between my four Sons viz - Adam Perkins Robinson to have his share where he now lives during his and his wifes natural life time or her neadwhere, and after their death, this share of my land to be equally divided

between their three grandchildren John, James, and Adam. I will and bequeath to my second Son, Isaac, One fourth part of the plantation where I now live, and that he shall have his share where he now lives. I also will and bequeath to my third Son John Simpson Robinson, one fourth part of the plantation whereon I now live, and to have his share laid off where he formerly lived. I also will and bequeath to my fourth Son, William Marion the one fourth part of the plantation whereon I now live, and that he shall have his share where I now live. And I order, that all these four shares, shall be so laid off, so that each of my sons can have a East way to the river, or branch for the convenience of water. I also will and bequeath unto Stephenas Sherrill, one dollar, I will and bequeath unto my Second Daughter, Betsey's Children, the one eighth part of which I shall have after mention. I also will unto Betty Sherrill, my Grand daughter, one Side Saddle, one and Calf - and bed and bedding, and the one half the house, I will and bequeath unto my fourth daughter, Rachel Long, one dollar. I also will and bequeath to my fifth Daughter, Sarah Day, one Dolor to be valued at Fifty dollars. If she does not get one before I die I also will unto William M. Robinson, the balance of my Stock, (namely) Horses, cattle, Hogs, Sheep, House hold and Kitchen furniture, all my farming and Mechanical tools. I also order that the plantation which I own in the County of Catawba, & in case I do not sell or dispose of previous to my death I allow it to be divided between my eight Children, or their heirs, namely, Adams & Robinson, Isaac & Robinson, John & Robinson, and Marion Robinson, Betty Asbury, Jane Sherrill, Rachel Long, Sarah Day or their heirs - after pay my debts to the best of my ability. I also order that if any of the above mentioned &c. &c. or legatees shall ever attempt either by law other wise to broke, or disannul this will, that they shall be cut out any thing that is left, & than in the former part of this will, and their share to be equally divided between all the rest of my heirs at law. I also nominate my two Sons, Robert and John S. Robinson and do request of them to execute this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal, this the twenty ninth of October in year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty five.
