Mary and Laura his sisters. And I want Alfredia to have as
much land to cultivate as he wants on the home place. And
all the remaining land to be divided out and all rents to come back
to Jane. And I want Alfredia to have his choice of my live
stocks and my wife gun and matches. And at the expiration
of Jane's widowhood or at her death. I want my land to be
divided equally between my six children. And then I want all my
children to choose their disinterested persons to value their lots equally.
(And what ever one lot is worth than I want my six children to make up
and pay equally to) Ida Sherrill the value of one lot no money
when she becomes twenty one years of age. And when
the land is divided there shall be no account be taken of
Jewel's goodens buildings.

standing, before God for the same, do make this
my last will and testimony, in writing and now fol-
lowing: I give, direct and bequeath unto my son T. G.
Monday a portion of my so as to include my present
home, and described and bounded as follows:

Beginning at a White Oak on Spencer Mondays and
run South $34\frac{1}{2}$ West 61 poles to a beginning at the
County bound road, thence South 35° West 109 poles to
the thence South 88 West 15 poles to a White oak near a
spruce, thence North 1° East 202 poles to a rock known
in former deeds as a Dogwood corner thence East, 5
poles, to a large Chestnut tree and thence South 48°
East 68 poles to a pine, Spencer Mondays corner.
thence South 76° East 35 poles to the beginning
containing twenty acres the same more or less, to
have and to hold to him and his heirs in fee
simple forever.

And I do nominate and constitute my son
A. W. Monday sole executor of this my last will and
Testament, hereby revoking and making void all
and every will or wills at any time before by me
made and do decree this to be my last will and
