Second. I give and devise to my two little grand
children Anna and Emily Luther two hundred
half dollars each and to my other grand
children Luther Luther five dollars.

Third. I give and devise to my son William
Farrar Cook all the residue of my property
whatever the above items are deducted there
from the small remains at home in a
proper care and provide for myself and
my wife during our declining years
and until we both shall die, that if at
any time I perform this duty then see that
such are kindly received both, ready and proper
manner (that is to say) in form in which we
will bequeath personalty to herself, to receive
proper care and care for me during our natural
lives.

Fourth. I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved
wife my executors to all intents and pur-
poses to execute this my last will and
testament according to the true meaning
thereof and hereto make and declare
utterly void all other wills and testaments
by me heretofore made.
