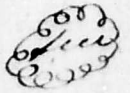

In the name of God amen. I Thomas Hurley
of the State of North Carolina and Chatham County
being at this time weak in Body, tho' of sound mind &
memory, do make and appoint this my last Will and
Testament as follows. First I give my soul to God who
gave it. Secondly, I give to the Earth from whence it
was taken to be decently buried at the discretion of my
executors or my surviving Executor. And as touching my
unlawful good, I give and bequeath to or rather devise
that two certain Tracts of lying and being in the County
& State aforesaid. One containing One Hundred & Fifty
acres, bounded by the line Madam Bryan & John
Burns and others. The containing Seventy Five acres
bounded by the line of John Hollawman, Samuel
Edmour and John Lee. All which land it is my
Will and desire that they should be sold to the
highest bidder in court of Twelve months. The money
arising therefrom to be appropriated as my Executors

may think most expedient for the Benefit of my Wife
I give and bequeath to my dutiful and beloved Wife
Hairy, the Mandation, wherewith I now live, containing Two hundred
and twenty Acres more or less; also one bow and arrow
one Bed Furniture, two Sown and Pigs — Also I give to my
Daughter Margaret, Fifty Five Dollars. — I give to my
Daughter Nancy, one Bed and Furniture and Fifty cents
To my Daughter Cynthia, I give one Bed and Furniture
and Fifty Dollars, unto my son John Hurley I give
the sum of Fifty Shillings with what he already had
To my son Elijah Hurley I give the sum of Fifty Shillings
with what he has had — And unto my son Coriah Hurley
I give the sum of Five Shillings with what he has already
had. To my Daughter Mary Ann I give the sum of
Five Shillings with what she has already had. To my
Daughter Delilah Widale the same sum of Five Shillings
with what she has had. Also to my Daughter Betsy
the Bryan I give the sum of Five Shillings and
what she has had. And unto my grand Daughter Lucy
M. Hurley I do give one Bed Furniture — And I do
nominate and appoint my son Aed Hurley, and my
son in law William Widale, as my faithful Executors
to execute this my last Will and Testament. As unto
which presents I have set my hand I appoint my last
day of In the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and thirty — Amos Hurley
