In the name of God amen. I Amnes Hurley  
of the State of North Carolina and Chatham County  
being at this time weak in Body, & tho' of sound mind &  
memory do make and appoint this my last Will and  
Testament as follows. First I give my soul to God who  
gave it. Secondly. Doay to the Earth from whence it  
was taken to be decently buried at the discretion of my  
executors or my surviving Friends. And as touching my  
unlucky good. I give and bequeath to a rather more  
that two certain Tracts of land and being on the County  
& state aforesaid One containing the sum of Thirtys  
acres bounded by the line Readin Bayard John  
Burns and others. The containing Sixty acres  
bounded by the lines of John Holloman, Samuel  
Gilmour and John Lott. All which land is my  
Wife and I wish that they should be sold to the  
highest bidder on trust of twelve months. The money  
arising therefrom to be appropriated as my Executors

may think most expedient for the Benefit of my Wm  
I give and bequeath to my dutiful and beloved Husband  
Harley, the Plantation, wherein I now live, containing two hundred  
and one hundred Acres more or less; also the house and furniture  
and the Slaves, two men and two women — Also I give to my  
Daughter Margaret, Fifty Two Dollars. — I give to my  
Daughter Nancy, one Head and Furniture and Fifty dollars  
to my Daughter Cynthia, I give one Head and Furniture  
and Fifty Dollars. unto my Son John Harley I give  
the sum of Five Shillings with what he has already had  
unto my Son Elijah Harley I give the sum of Five Shilling  
with what he has had. — Also unto my Son Edward Harley  
I give the sum of Five Shillings with what he has already  
had. To my Daughter Albany also I give the sum of  
Five Shillings with what she has already had. To my  
Daughter Delilah Riddale the same sum of Five Shillings  
with what she has had. Also to my Daughter Barbara  
the Morgan I give the sum of Five Shillings and  
what she has had. Also unto my grand Daughter Liza  
W. Harley I give One Head Furniture — And do  
nominate and appoint my Son Acal Harley, and my  
Son in law Britain Riddale, as my, Faithfull Executors  
to execute this my last Will and Testament. On which  
which Executors I have set my hand & appointed my last  
will of In the year of our Lord one thousand eight  
hundred & eleven — Given at Princeton
