mind and memory but considering the un-
certainty of my earthly existence do declare
this my last will and testament in manner
and form following

First That my executors hereinafter named
shall provide for my body a decent burial
suitable to the wishes of my relations and
friends pay all funeral expenses together
with my just debts however and to whom
soever owing out of the money that may
first come into his hand as a part or
parcel of my Estate

2nd I give and devise to my beloved wife
Eleanor Fox one hundred acres of land
I now live on during her natural life
including my mansion and all out houses
and other improvements in satisfaction
for in lieu of her dower and third of and
all of my real Estate

3rd I give and devise to my beloved wife
Eleanor Fox one hundred dollars in cash
all of my house hold and kitchen furniture
her choice of my black cows forever

4th I give and devise to my beloved wife
Eleanor Fox a years support for her own
family out of my crop & stock and pot
5th

I give and devise to my beloved son
Josiah B. Fox the balance of the land
I now live on to include the houses he
now is in possession of and lives in at
this time to him and his heirs in fee
simple

6th I give and devise to my beloved son
Joseph S. Fox after the death of beloved
wife the hundred acres of land I called
to her during her natural life to him
and his heirs in fee simple forever

7th I give and devise to my beloved
sons Horace Fox Henry Fox Lewis Taylor
Fox my tract of land adjoining the
lands of Samuel Smith and ~~one~~ one
of my sons Horace, Henry & Lewis Taylor
Fox is to pay to my son Isaac twenty
two dollars in cash for his share of
the land to have and to hold to them
lives in fee simple forever.

8th I give and devise to my beloved
son Solomon J. Fox the tract of
land he now lives on in fee simple
forever to him and his heirs.

9th I will and devise that all the
residue of my estate not heretofore
disposed of be equally divided between
my six sons Joseph S., Josiah B. Henry
Isaac, Horace and Lewis Taylor Fox and
lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint
my beloved son Joseph S. Fox my lawful
executor to all intents and purposes to
execute this my last will and Testament
according to the true and and meaning
of the same and every part and clause
thereof hereby revoking and declaring
thoroughly void all other wills and Testa-
ments by me heretofore made
In testimony whereof I the said
David Fox do hereunto set my hand
and seal this the 25th day of August
A.D. 1854

First That my Executors hereafter named shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relations and friends and pay all funeral expences together with my just debts howsoever and to whom ever owing out of the monys that may first come into their hands as a part or parcel of my Estate

1st Item I give to my beloved Brother John Lane all the notes and accounts that I hold against him at the time of my death on conditions that he bring no claim against my Estate which I hold before my death I also give my said Brother Mr. S. Lane one thousand dollars in money to be paid to him by my Executors as soon as col lected a part of my Estate also twenty

the waters of Hicks Branch as by appearance

wife more fully appear also sixty two
acres of land more or less lying on flat
creek

2nd Item I give and bequeath to my beloved
ister Elizabeth Bray and the heirs of her body
and my beloved Sister Margaret Brooks and
the heirs of her body & to the children of my
deceased Sister Martha Lambert &c all the
land that descended to me from my Father the
except that hereinafter disposed of and also one
except the meeting house lot as is laid off and
marked round and one half acre round the
grave yard except also a portion of land
containing some fields commencing on the line
of the John Bray Tract at the North side of
a Cotton patch field running west for enough
on a south course to take in the field thence
thence south to the end of the lane thence west
along the fence to the big road thence a south
limition along said road to Job & Brays line
thence east with his line to the line known as
the Hughes land that is to say Elizabeth Bray
in her children one third part of said land
and to Margaret Brooks and her children
in their part of said land, and to Sister Martha
Lamberts children one third part of said
and to have and to hold provided they never
come upon the River of Abraham Lane &c or
any division for any portion of the lands that
they inherited from me or said decedent

Item I give and bequeath all my right in the
lands that I bought of John Lamberts interest
in to Sister Martha's children one hundred
dollars each as many of them as may be alive
at my death to be paid by my executors as
part of my estate,

Item I give to Sister Margaret Brooks all
the notes and accounts that I hold against Thomas
Brooks her husband provided they bring no
claims against my estate that they held before
my death,

Item I give to my Sister Elizabeth Bray
all the notes and accounts that I hold against
Jeremiah S Bray provided they bring no claim
against my estate that they held before my death
I also give my Sister Elizabeth Bray five hun-
dred dollars in money to be paid to her by my
executors as soon as collected

Item I give to the following of my brothers John
S Lane to wit Susan S Lane James S Lane John
R Lane, Elizabeth A Lane and Abram Lane
The following negro slaves namely, Sarah, Fred
Harris Wesley and Leslie the oldest child to take
apprais'd negro dies before they get them in pos-
session there is to be another about as good put in
the place of it,

Item I give to Ammonity Lane daughter of my
brother Andrew Lane one negro Slave by the
name of Caroline

Item I give to my brother John S Lane children
including Wincy Le Jordan and Mary A Brown

and my brother Andrew Lane one childless
son their lawful offspring to have all the balance
of my property except that he might dispose of
to those and those alike, but my desire is
that my negro shall not be sold nor my negro
women and small children parted and if in
the division there cannot be an equalable
division is the slaves without parting the
woman and small children then it is my
desire that one lot or lots be made in money
and none of said children is to come upon
the heirs of Abram Lane son my father for
any of the lands inherited from said deceased
they do they are no longer to hold any of
the property which I have willed to them

Item I give and bequeath to James S Lane
John R Lane and Abram S Lane the place
where I now live known by the name of the
John Bray plantation, also the plantations
known by the name of The Hughes place also
portion of the old place or Abram Lane's
plantation described in Item 3 wd of this
my last will and Testament the three to
divide said land equally between themselves

Item It is my will and desire that my executors
hereafter mentioned shall have the ground given
in the old place well enclosed by a stone wall
with two gates and pay for the same out of
a part of my estate also I wish three stones
set up at my Father's Brother's Isa Sister Martha
as my own grave and pray for us before
departed
