family then my will is that my executor shall sell him
and purchase such land as he and my executor may
think best. The remainder of my property I also give
and bequeath to my wife Susanna to enable her to raise
and school the Children except so much as she and
my executor think proper to sell to pay my debts and
other use for the family and all monies arising in any
manner from my estate to be equally divided among
my Children when the youngest becomes of age
and I hereby make and ordain my Brother John
McKee executor of this my last will and testament
in witness whereof I the said Francis McKee have to this
my last will and Testament set my hand and seal
the say and year above written

In the name of god Amen I Do hereby declare of the County
of Chatham and State of S^c Carolina being engrossed in body
but of despairing mind and memory therefore calling to mind
the mortality of my body do make and ordain this to be
my last will and testament in manner and form
following That my will is that all my last debts be paid

I lend to my daughter Elizabeth Tyson my negro woman
Lacy and her two Children Eury and Eliza and my negro boy
Gangs with their increase during the time of her natural
life and at her death my will is that the said negro
with the increase be equally divided between all the surviving
Children of my said daughter Elizabeth to be three then four
and a fifth forever. I give to my daughter Elizabeth
Tyson one Father bed and furniture and my bed and
Chair to her her new dress forever.

I give to my grand son Edward S^c Morris my negro
boy Jim and my negro girl Kinder also one feather bed
and furniture provided nevertheless that if the said
Edward S^c Morris should die without lawful
issue of his body that then the said negro boy Jim
should be equally divided equally between all the surviving
Children of my daughter Elizabeth Tyson and the negro
girl Kinder with her increase should be equally divided
and between all the surviving Children of my daughter
Sarah Morris to be three then four and a fifth for-
ever. I lend to my daughter Sarah Morris during the
Term of her natural life my negro woman Hannah and
her three Children Joe Will and Charles and my negro
man Jim also one feather bed and furniture and
my wagon. And at the death of my said daughter
Sarah my will is that the said negro with their
increase the feather bed and wagon shall be
equally divided amongst all the surviving Children
of my said daughter Sarah to be three then four
and a fifth forever. I give to my son in law John

I give one dollar I give to my grand son
 Edward McNamee my black filly called Hunter
 to him and his heirs forever - I give to my grand
 daughter Betty McNamee my gray filly called Rose
 to her and her heirs forever. All the residue and remainder
 of my estate of whatever kind I give to my two daughters
 Sarah McNamee and Elizabeth Tyson to be equally
 divided between them lastly I constitute and appoint
 my friend Thomas Chipman and my son in law Break
 Tyson executor of this my last will and testament
 in witness whereof I do hereunto set my hand and seal
 this twenty fifth day of August one thousand eight
 hundred and eighteen
