sum of five shillings. I give to Sarah my Daughter eight
pounds of bone and two hundred weight of pork. I give to my son
Thomas K. Griffis the sum of five shillings. I give to my son Joseph
Buchanan my title. I give to my Daughter Susanna Buchanan
the sum of five shillings. I give to my son May Buchanan
one negro woman named Grace and one negro boy named
James and all the bed of bone and water and the plantation
interior and one bed and furniture and all the rest of the house
hold furniture and two horses I give to my Daughter
Frances Griffis one bed and furniture and all my wearing
clothes and all the cloth, and the rest of the stock of cattle
and hogs to be sold and all my just debts paid and if any
left I give it to my son May and finally I do appoint Richard
Drake to be my whole and sole Executor to fulfill this my last
will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal this 2 Day of January 1805

estate be equally divided between the above named six children
which was not born in wedlock but are the fruits of my body
and I make them equal heirs of my estate by this my
last will and Testament and I hereby make and ordain my
worthy friend J. W. Noble Executor of this my last will
and Testament In witness whereof I the said William Phillips
