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Elizabeth O'Kelly of Chatham County and State of North Carolina Being in soundness of mind do constitute this my last will and Testament, cordially and solemnly according to the true and honest Intention of these premises, First as to my body and soul God being the former of my body and the Father of my spirit I commend them at ~~this time~~ his care my body to the earth from whence it came and my soul to God who gave it in full assurance of a resurrection and a comfortable hope of a resurrection, as to my temporal property, it is my will to dispose of as follows to wit, I give to Dinah Pilgrim two hundred Dollars or rather leave it in the hands of my Executor to put it out on trust for her to live on as she sees she stands in need of, Also I lend her a pair of ears and what one big fat pail and piggins and tubs flat from coffee milk, a half dozen little plates two dishes a case of knives and forks two basins and not to make sugar bowl and coffee pot during her natural life and at her death if any be left it is to come back after paying those for the trouble they will be at for keeping her and be divided as I shall now name, I give to my son John O'Kelly one dollar and what he has already received to him and his heirs forever. I give and bequeath to Joseph Atkinson one dollar and what he has already received to him and his heirs forever. After my Just debts are paid it is my will and desire that all my property money In hand notes and accounts be divided equally between Mary E O'Kelly John Mc Carley Franklin O'Kelly Lucinda O'Kelly heirs on share, Lucinda Anderson William J O'Kelly Saml Barber Thomas J Fowler Delina B O'Kelly Mary J Dilts and Mollsey Mapes, the five women be allowed to do what she please with her own, I constitute

committed in this life and will extend to promote my
glorifying rest in that which is to come.
