 County of Chatham in North Carolina being weak and sick but
 of sound mind and memory thank be to almighty god for this
 thought calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing
 it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain
 this to be my last will and Testament in presence and form
 following. My first and principally I commend - my immortal
 soul into the hand of almighty god that give it, hoping that the
 merits of my blessed redeemer to inherit life everlasting
 world without end where it hath pleased god to bless me I order
 and dispose of it in the following manner; first my will is that
 all my just debts and funeral expences be paid. Item I give to my
 beloved granddaughter Charlotte Powell wife of William Powell
 my chest, also my bed and all the bed clothes except the rug and
 chieftain sheet which I give to my beloved Daughter Delilah I should
 have been here and a legacy for her. Item I give to my beloved grand
 daughter ^{Wm Powell, Thomas Powell, Saml Powell, Henry Powell, & John Powell} ~~Charlotte Powell~~ the third part
 of the residue of my estate both real and personal to be equally
 divided amongst them as they come of age to their then heirs
 and assigns forever. All the residue and remainder of my
 estate of whatever kind or quantity it may consist I give and
 bequeath to my beloved son John Harrington and my beloved
 daughter Elizabeth I permit to be equally divided amongst
 them, to them their heirs and assigns forever. Lastly I do hereby
 appoint my beloved son Harrington Executor of this my last will and
 Testament in witness whereof I do hereunto set my hand and seal this
 day of May 1798 signed & sealed in presence of Elizabeth Bryant
 Thomas Powell, William Powell, Returni, Approved at Nov 1798
