to my daughter Mary one Burrough, one side board
One Chest one feather Bed and one York and do give
and bequeath to my daughter Elizsey One feather bed
one fall leaf table one burrough and One Chest and
do give and bequeath to my wife Elizabeth F. Henry four
head of cattle and fourteen head of sheep and all the hogs
and the Mares and the gray Horses left for the use of
the plantation - and all the farming material left use of
maintaining the children and do give and bequeath to
my wife Elizabeth F. Henry the Woods and the balance
of household and Kitchen furniture as long as she has a
widow and after her death to be equally divided between
the children - I now leave John Hill and John Hall
as Executors we as witness being present at this time
do believe that he is in his proper mind
