man Eliza one Negro boy Jack one first choice horse one

one first choice Cow and calf one sow and pig one
head and bed and furniture first choice one green
cheist four chairs some kitchen furniture and one

year provision for herself and family to live and live
 here forever — Then I give to my daughter Malunday
 Barber one Negro Man Abram one Negro Woman Peg one
 Negro boy Charles one young Mare that is calld hearn
 Second Choece. haw and calf one sow and pigs one
 head and Lard and furniture Second Choece one head
 table four chairs some Kitchen furniture and one year
 provision for her and her family to her and her heirs
 forever — Then I further give to my two daughters Patsy
 Barber and Malunday Barber two old Negroes buff and
 Han and provision for one year for them to them and
 their heirs forever — Then I give to my daughter Polly
 Rogers Children Green Regin Malunday Regin George
 Regin Luther Regin three hundred and fifty
 Dollars to be equally divided between the four children
 after the death of these Mother if all aliving if any should
 be dead and leave heirs they are to have there fathers
 or Mothers part and if any should be dead and leave
 no one are the surviving Legaters is to divide the whole
 first I reserve that the three hundred and fifty dollars
 is to be left in some friends hands and that part
 out at Int. and the Interest arising from it to be
 made use of to help to support the Mother and Children
 yearly I also give to the aforesaid ^{named} Children one sorrel
 Horse two cows and one calf that these Mother claims
 one Sow and Pigs four Cheas to be made use of as the
 Money part and one year provision for Mother and
 Children and after the death of these Mother to them
 and their heirs forever — Then I give to my son Pleasant
 Barber supposed to be four hundred and ninety six
 Acres of Land whereon I now live bounded by George

William L. Wham William Sarah Barbic Gray Barbic Jun^r Mr. Mission
Ser to him and his heirs forever and the rest of my estate to be sold
at nine or twelve Month Credit which may be thought best and
of any to pay my debts and if any over divide it equal with
all my children and appoint my son pleasant Barbic and
my son in Law Icham Williams my executors given under my
hand and seal this 1th of August 1829

In the name of God Amen I William Moran of the County of
Chatham and State of North Carolina being weak of body
but of perfect mind and memory knowing that it is once ap-
pointed for all men to die I make and ordain this my last
will and Testament in manner and form as follows Viz
I recommend my body to a decent burial and my soul
to the God that gave it and as to what worldly goods it
has pleased God to bless me with it is my desire they shall be
disposed of in the following manner —

I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Delilah Moran
all that tract or parcel of land whereon I now live during
her Natural life and at her death to be divided between
my Son William and John Moran as follows the Long
Branch to be the line until it comes to the Meadow
since then run with the Meadow fence a strait course
thence the old field until it strikes ^{this} branch again then
down said branch to the lower line the Land lying
on the east side of said branch I will and bequeath to
my son William Moran after the death of his Mother
