 year and longer if any land becomes so it is not worth the
 same terms I desire it to be over all the other property
 except my bed and furniture I desire Wright S. Godd
 to have the use of it and I hereby make and ordain my
 friend Charles Bennett executor of this my last Will and
 Testament and Guardian for Wright S. Godd In Witness
 whereof I the said Herbert H. Godd have to this my
 last Will and Testament set my hand and seal the
 day above written

two year old filly two cows & one yearling one yoke oxen and east
two head hogs all my ploughs & farming tools and also all my
bed & beds together with all other of my household & kitchen furniture
during her natural life time & after her decease to be divided
in the following manner, - I give to my beloved Grandson William
Apchurch one horse & saddle & fifteen dollars in money if he
remains with my wife or other part of my family untill he is
twenty one years of age if not the property to return to my children
namely William, Archer and Gilliam Patrick and the balance
of my estate as follows, one sorrel horse to my son Archer
Patrick and all the balance sold & after my son William
& Archer Patrick receive seventy five dollars each then for
Gilliam, William & Archer Patrick to share and share
alike - I also give unto my daughter Letitia Patrick
two dollars & no more believing that I have given her
a full share before. And I hereby make & ordain
my son William Patrick executor of this my last will
