Wiggles every thing that fall to me by will or herishid in any way either lands or money notes money or any thing I may possess at my decease to be equally divided amongst the above named - I then by make and ordain to be my Executor to this my last will & testament - I set my hand and seal the day and year above written -

In the name of God I Isaac Edwards Armistead of the County of Chatham and State of North Carolina being in my Eighty fourth year of my age and in a declining state of health but sound in mind & memory as usual thank be to God for it do make & ordain this paper writing to be my last will & testament in manner & form following (viz) I give that all my just debts be punctually paid & I give I have already given off to my sons William Armistead, Robert Horn Armistead and my daughter Mary Hooker all the property that I designed or allotted for them.

1. Item I leave to my woman Lucy Clark (alias) Lucy Armistead Fifty acres of land whereon I now live including my dwelling house, and all other out houses that shall be considered necessary for her comfort also one negro woman by the name of Mary one bed bedstead and furniture, one pot, one oven, one tub, wiggint pale, all the gear and poultry all my sitting chair, one table all my Carthens, wares, bins, and posts, one spinning wheel & cards, during her natural life and after the death of said Lucy I direct that the above named property as aforesaid be sold and equally divided amongst my legatees hereafter named I now give to the aforesaid Lucy Clark (alias) Lucy Armistead & family one years provision.

4. Item I give and bequeath unto the children of the said Lucy Clark (alias) Lucy Armistead, which I claim & believe to be my children (viz) to my daughter Sybil daughter of the above named Lucy one seventh part of my estate that is not disposed of heretofore - also one seventh to Joseph, also one seventh part to Anthony and one seventh part to Julia they being the sons and daughters of the said Lucy Clark (alias) Lucy Armistead. I give to my grand daughter Mary Temple one seventh part of said estate, I give to the children of my daughter Elizabeth Barber one seventh of said estate having given off six sevenths of my estate the last and seventh part I give to my grand son William Preston Barber son of my daughter Mary Barber - and should William Preston Barber die leaving no issue or bodily heir I direct that the said seventh part or portion allotted to him as aforesaid drop back in my estate and be equally divided amongst the legatees above named - all of which I give to them and their heirs forever -
