

In the name of God Amen, I, Isaac Mann of North Carolina, Chatham County being of sound mind and perfect memory (knowing to be God) do this twenty fifth day of February in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and thirty six, make and publish this my will and testament in manner following: to say first, I give and bequeath to my son Isaac Mann, a parcel of land lying on the south west side of Bloody Creek beginning on a dogwood tree running east seventy five poles to a black oak then south thirty four poles to white oak and hickory, then east by three poles degrees, north two hundred poles to a red and hickory, then north twenty three degrees, west by four poles to a gum and maple, then west sixteen poles to a Spanish oak, then north five poles to a dogwood, then west seventy four poles to a dogwood then north thirty two poles to a post oak, then west one hundred and five poles to a post oak, then west two hundred poles to the beginning, containing two hundred acres by computation.

Secondly, I do will and bequeath to my beloved daughter, a reasonable support out of the remaining part of my lands and perishable during her natural life or widow hood.

Thirdly, I do will and bequeath to my other children that is to say Frederick Mann and daughters including that is to say, Elizabeth Mary, Lucy, Sarah, Maria, Rachel and Nancy all the remaining part of my personal estate to be equally divided among them as common heirs.

I do hereby make and ordain my worthy friends Aleton, Executor of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I the said Isaac Mann have to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal the day and year above written.

Signed, sealed, published and declared by Isaac Mann as his last will and testament in the presence of us who were present at the time of signing and sealing thereof.

I, Kelly Hooshee of the County of Chatham and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last will and testament in manner and form following: that is to say, First that my Executor herein after named shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relatives, and friends and pay all funeral expenses together with just debts however and to whosoever owing out of the moneys that may first come to hand into his hands a part of my estate, Item first to William Elmore, I give two beds and furniture, Item I give my son James Webster one Civer lid that has red in it one decanter & a side of leather worth a dollar & one pine table painted tilt & one stone pot Item, I give all remainder of Chair to Kelly Hooshee Item, give to Richard Webster, son, one decanter and glass & one book & one ~~white~~ counterpan his choice, Item I give to Kelly Hooshee one figured counterpan

Item, I give to Stephen Moore one large water pot, Item, I give to Gatoey Coal one tilt Item, I give to Elizabeth Webster one tilt Item, I give to Mary Poe one middle size dish and one water and bread basket Item I give to Kelly Elmore one frock her choice
