presents may come greeting wheras I James  
Lindley of the County of Chatham and State  
of North Carolina calling to mind the un-  
certainty of time and the great certainty of death  
do this the twenty first day of the fourth month  
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight  
hundred and forty nine make and publish  
this my last will and testament when in  
good health and understanding in manner  
form as followeth

It is my will and desire  
that my body be decently buried, secondly  
that all my just debts be paid, it is my  
will that Elizabeth Eleanor and Nancy have  
my waggon and two horses and gears a two horse  
plow a one horse plow a rippon plow double  
tree and single tree two axes one mallet  
two hives, and all that is in the cupboard  
and the loom and all its contents and pot iron  
and water vessels, and other ware sufficient  
for house keeping, except Eleanor ~~leaveth them~~  
if she does her claim is to be void as to the  
aboves that Elizabeth and Nancy have the  
two stands of drawers this is in my house and  
a chest apiece a cow and calf apiece and few  
sheep apiece and ten head of hogs and a table  
apiece and all my bees, that Elizabeth have  
my desk, that Elizabeth Eleanor Mary &  
Nancy have the pector. Elizabeth and Nancy  
to have two beds and bedding apiece a cotton  
and a flax wheel apiece that Sarah

Thomas David Owen and William  
 shall have the land that I now own and  
 live on by paying two hundred dollar to  
 the estate which is estimated at about  
 four hundred acres, it is my will that  
 Elizabeth have two hundred and fifty  
 dollars that Eleanor have three hundred  
 & forty dollars that Mary have three  
 hundred dollars that Nancy have four  
 hundred dollars, that my books be equally  
 divided among my children that lives in  
 this country that Owen and William have  
 any my crops cut saw and grow and  
 log chain and my wearing apparel that  
 my Grandson James Lindley if he live  
 with my family till he comes of age shall  
 have some more schooling and fifty dollars &  
 a colt. That Jonathan Lindley have  
 five dollars if he live to come of  
 age there are of my son Jonathan Lindley  
 (Dec'd). That Elizabeth Eleanor & Nancy have  
 six chas apiece that my Daughter Martha  
 children namely Susanna & Henry and  
 Alfred to bear an equal part with the  
 other in that remains of my per  
 sonal property that is not willed that is  
 shall be sold and equally divided that when  
 I am gone my family have a year provision  
 that my threshing machine and cutting machine  
 shall belong to Owen Williams & Elizabeth &  
 Nancy Lastly I constitute and appoint my  
 sons Owen Lindley and William Lindley

my whole or sole <sup>334</sup> executors in pur-  
tuly for the purpose herein mentioned  
in witness hereof I have hereunto set my  
hand and seal the day and year above written

In the name of God amen I being in my general  
health of body and mind do desire to make  
provision for my decease by appointing Louisa  
Taylor to be my executrix and that she may  
think most proper to be her counsellor to aid her  
in settling and dividing my property after the  
following direction I desire all my just  
debts should be paid out of the sum of money  
now in C. S. Williams hands on interest and  
all that afterwards remains in his possession  
I leave to my sister Mary together with the  
tables and sideboard now in her house  
with the two trunks, to Mary R. Williams  
I give my bureau to Henry C. Collins I  
give my travelling trunk to Elizabeth Collins  
I give my workstand and to her sister S. Collins  
I give my breast pin to S. A. Williams I give  
my candle stand and rocking chair to Louisa  
Taylor I give my bed and bedstead with the  
curtains to Anne Busbee I give my table spoon  
and to Julia Taylor I give my tea spoons and  
sugar tongs to James G. Taylor I give a boy by the name  
of Hank to Julia Taylor I give a girl by the name of  
Kerry to William Collins, my children I give a girl  
named Olivia and a boy named Andrew the boy and  
two women named George Kitty and Sarah which  
three were named in my mothers will I leave to be  
hereafter disposed of I give to my sister Jones Davis
