these present premises First As to my body and Soul
God being the former of my body and the Father of my
Soul Spirit I surrender them at ^{his} call my body to
the earth from whence it came and Soul to God who
gave it in full assurance of a resurrection and com-
-table hope of Acceptance - As to my temporal property it
is my will to dispose of it as follows - Item I give and
bequeath unto my Son John O'Reilly five dollars -
and what he has already received to him and his heirs forever
Item I give and bequeath unto the Heirs of my Son William O'Reilly
deceased ten dollars and what they have already received to
them and their heirs forever Item I give and bequeath unto my
dear and loving wife Elizabeth O'Reilly after my last debts are
paid every cent worth of property of every kind horses
Hoggs cattle sheep household and kitchen furniture plantation
utensils Monies Bonds notes of hands to the last cent of property
At her own disposal forever Let a free man hath a right to
do what he will with his own I constitute this my last
will and Testament Moreover I appoint John O'Reilly
Ex-ecutor to this my last will and testament in
witness whereof I have set my hand and affixed my seal
this twelveth day of April 1826

crosses and running with the River to a walnut tree above
the dam including the land said land and mill with gear down
the River to the first Station Secondly I give and bequeath to
my son Edward Brantly James Brantly and my daughter Hannah
Burns Polly Burns Coby Brantly heirs of Georgia Elizabeth
Brantly heirs of Georgia Sarah Justice of the State of Georgia
Barbara Diction of Alabama and Eliza Harrington All
the balance of my property Not hereinafter herein mentioned
to be sold on a Credit of twelve Months my lands to-
gether with all Not hereafter mentioned and to be equally
divided share and share alike and I hereby make
and Ordain my worthy son James Brantly executor of
this my last will and Testament in witness
whereof I the said Elizabeth Brantly have to this my last
will and Testament Set my hand and seal the year
and day herein written Signed sealed and published
and declared by the said Elizabeth Brantly Elizabeth Brantly

Chatham County North Carolina lasteth month twelve last and the year
eight hundred and twenty three - The following is my last Will and
Testament 1st I appoint my son Tomie Dixon to execute this my
Will, directing him to pay all my last accounts -
2nd My wife Sarah having expressed her last just desires for down with
about of land on Little Rock Creek the quantity of two hundred acres which
she is sole heir of by her Testament - But with the prospect of
understanding her condition more comfortable & easy I give her during
her life the full privilege of all my Possessions which I now live
the spring, Richards - her choice of a hand creature, her bed and
bed clothes, my two wheel riding carriage & harness, and one thousand
to dispose of at discretion with liberty of taking for fuel & repairing
when at her choice on the East end of my tract of land containing said farm
& the maintenance thereof also that she have the use of her riding horse which
in that situation I may think large, but I wish at last may be found after
discharging the necessary expenses of this last illness on board (said
board not to be maintained) which is for the use of the family, namely
Sophie & John who are to live with her, if she and they all choose
I also give her my slaves for the use of said family
3rd I give to my sons Joel & Silas & daughter Edith Puckett & the
two children of George & William Puckett each one dollar
& said Edith abovesaid entitled to said Dictionary
4th I give to my son Tomie Dixon his heirs & assigns for ever the west
end of the tract of land I now live on within the bounds as follows
Beginning on the North East corner of said tract at a post Oak my own
and Lewis Jones's corner & running East along said Jones's line one
hundred & six poles to a Spanish Oak, thence South one hundred
and twelve poles to a Spanish Oak, thence East six degrees North
thirty eight poles to a stand Gum in the corner of an Old field, thence
South six degrees east sixty seven poles to a Spanish Oak on
Johnsons line thence West one hundred & fifty seven poles to a
Belt on an original corner of my tract thence North along
the woods line one hundred & thirty poles to the beginning

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
