In the name of God amen. I Samuel Noble
planter of the County of Chatham and State of North
Carolina, being in a low state of health and of sound
mind taking into consideration the certainty of death
some time or other, do think proper to leave behind me
these lines which is my last Will and Testament
partially, and give of all I possess my soul to
almighty God that gave it, and my body to the
earth, to be buried in Christian like manner at the
discretion of my friends, and as touching my worldly
substance wherewith I have bin blessed God to
bless me with, I do dispose of as follows (to wit)
First of all, I give and bequeath unto my dearly beloved
wife Sam Noble during her life or widowhood the
Land and Manure plantation wherewith I have
together with that part of my other property as follows
my Negro fellow Harry & my sister Mrs. Cummings
and all my cows of age and the whole of my

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other stock consisting of Cattle Sheep, Hogs plantation tools
& Hatter Shop together with the hold of my Households
property only such furniture, as I shall give to other minis-
ters below in my Will. My Will also is that my children
remain with with their mother till they are of age
until she should think proper to give them tracts -
that I give and bequeath unto my five sons, James
Cypson, Correll, Josiah & John, the Land where I am
after the death or marriage of my wife, and the land
where James and Cypson now live to be divided between
them and if it should be more for them than the other is
for the other three, for them James and Cypson to pay
up to the other three according to valuation, and as soon
as the above valuation is made, on those lands for right
to be made to them as fast as they come of age the
five above mentioned sons, but not so as to dispossess my
wife of her dower. And my Will is that my three sons
that is now under age for them to have one share
Bride and Saddle a piece at their marriage or mar-
riage to be laid out of my estate and I give and
bequeath unto my son Eph^r Noble one good be-
half size of furniture and one Cow and calf. And
I next give and bequeath unto my dear Mother
one bed and furniture, one new Saddle, one Horse
& Saddle to be delivered at her marriage, a Shroud
and one Case drawers at her Mother's death
And I next give and bequeath unto my daughter

233 Lydia Mombie one Bed Furniture, one Table, and one
 Horse and Saddle to be delivered at her marriage or
 funeral and one Desk and Book Case at her
 brother's death and the balance of my estate consisting
 of the Millins Lane 111 Acres, one Waggon Horse and
 of Horses together with other such property as my Wife
 thinks proper to spare to be sold, and my Will is for
 Harry if he lives after the death of my Wife to equally
 belong to my two youngest sons, Josiah and John and
 as to the balance of my estate after all my debts is
 discharged I wish to be equally divided among all
 my Children. And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint
 my Wife and two sons James & John Lyon Mombie
 sole and sole executors of this my last Will and
 Testament, hereby revoking, annulling and making
 void all other former Wills & Testaments by me made
 ratifying and confirming this and no other as my
 last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand and Seal this twentieth day of July
 in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
 and thirteen.
