I do make and ordain this to be my last will and Testament in manner and form as follows: first of all my will is to recommend my soul to a mighty God that gave it, and for my poor frail body to have a decent burial by my children; My will is that all my just debts be paid my wife is after that; that the legal heirs of my son Reuben Cole deceased shall have one third part of all my estate that I am in possession of, that is not willed away, by my husband William Cole deceased after my death my will further is that my sons Isaiah Cole and William Cole shall have my decesse, and equally, divide the other two thirds of all my earthly estate that I am in possession of at the time of my death. that is not willed away by my abovenamed husband William Cole my will further is that the legal heirs of my son Reuben Cole have each of them One dollar in cash after my decease, and my will further is that Isaiah Cole my son and William Cole my son have after my death, each a counterpane and pillow case and my will further is that my son Isaiah Cole have after my decease the newest bed quilt, and for my son William Cole to have the next newest newest bed quilt that I am in possession of, also my will further is, and I do this day, make and appoint my beloved son Isaiah Cole my lawful Executor, and furthermore I make and ordain this to be my last will and Testament

 One cupboard and all the earthenware belonging to it;
 Three sitting chairs, one third of the land I now live on
 including my dwelling house on water, salt and washing tubs
th give and bequeath to my wife Maryan Horton five
 hundred pounds of Pork fifteen barrels Corn, Twenty pounds
 sugar Ten pound coffee

th I give and bequeath unto my two sons namely Daniel
 Horton & Jack Horton all the lands I now possess or
 may own at my death

th I give and bequeath unto my Grandson Jeff. Horton
 son of Jack Horton Twenty five dollars.

th I give and bequeath unto my two sons and three daughters
 namely Daniel Horton Mary Horton Jack Horton
 Elizabeth Brewer and Michael Moore the residue of
 my estate that I have not heretofore willed away, to be
 equally divided amongst them

th And lastly I do hereby nominate appoint and ordain
 my truly friends William Merritt John Lasater and
 Jack Horton or either two of them or either of them
 my Executors or Executors to this my last will and
 Testament in manner and form as above stated and
 acknowledge this and this only to be my last
 will and Testament as above stated

 Elizabeth Brewer and Meael Moore the residue of
 my estate that I have not heretofore willed away, to be
 equally divided amongst them

th And lastly I do hereby nominate appoint and ordain
 my truly friends William Merritt John Lasater and
 Joel Herton or either two of them or either of them
 my Executors or Executors to this my last will and
 testament in manner and form as above stated and
 acknowledge this and this only to be my last
 will and Testament as above stated
