 being very sick but perfect in mind and memory
 on the mortality of my body knowing that it is appointed
 for all men once to die, do first and principally
 and bequeath my soul into the hands of almighty
 God that gave it and my Body to be buried in Christian
 like burial at the direction of my Executors, not
 doubting but at the resurrection to receive the same
 my property I will and bequeath in the manner
 & form as followeth. Unto my beloved Wife I leave

Land I now live on containing of sixty Acres the same more
 or less also one pound of iron and two Cows, also all my household
 and Kitchen Furniture, also my plantation working Tools, also
 the whole of my Stock of Cattle and Hogs, to her during her
 life time or widowhood my Waggon and Gear to be
 sold with my Warehouse Tools, and the money apply as
 much of it as may do to satisfy all my last debts, the
 balance if any of any I leave to my Wife or above mentioned
 with all the money now due me, but after the death or
 marriage of my beloved Wife the whole of my property
 above mentioned or whatsover may be left after raising
 of my Children I give to be equally divided between or
 amongst my five daughters, namely Mary Whitaker
 Betsey Eliza Patsy, Leaslip, Polly & Anna, I leave
 I leave, giving I leave to William Collier and my
 beloved Wife Executors of this my last Will and Testament
 this the 13th day of February 1809.
