In the name of God amen I John Crow
of the County of Chatham and State of North Carolina
do hereby inform in body but of sound mind & memory
thereupon calling to mind the mortality of my body
& knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die
do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament
in manner as a form following. My wish is that
all my Just debts be regularly discharged.
I give to my beloved Wife Sarah Crow during her
life and to her the use of Fifty Acres of Land including
the House wherein I now live to be laid off in such
manner as she may direct; likewise one Grey

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Mare called a Pig, One Feather Bed and Furniture, One
Shaw and Quilt, One Washing Tub, One Axe, One Family Bible
One Cow and Calf, One Sow and Pigs, One Hair Cane and
Cotton Wheel, One Lining Wheel, One Loom, two Rustic Chairs
One Desk, Six Glass Plates, and the Kitchen Furniture
also two Negroes by the names of Lucy and Betty. My
Will and desire is that at the expiration of the widowhood
of my said Wife, or at her death, which ever should first
happen, that the said two Negroes Betty & Lucy with
their increase should be equally divided between my three
sons, Reuben, James & John Crow to be theirs and their
heirs for ever. The remainder of the property which I
have lent my Wife except the Land at her death, to be
equally divided amongst all my Children. I give to
my son J. P. Crow a tract of Land adjoining
Athens & Cotton called the Copeland place situated at
Seventy Five Acres to him his heirs and assigns forever
I give to my daughter Rachel Smith ten Shillings
I give to my son James Crow, one Tract of Land
lying in Hatteras County, or Henry, North Carolina
situated at Three Hundred and Twenty Acres, also one Feather
Bed & Furniture to him and his heirs. I give to my
son John Crow one Feather Bed & Furniture. I give to
my son Gabriel Crow, One Feather Bed & Furniture, one
Bay Horse called a Fox, One Cow & Calf, and one
Negro Boy named Larkin. I give to my son Johnson
