In the name of God amen. I Joseph Glapen of the County of Chatham and State of North Carolina being very sick but of sound mind and memory. Upon calling to mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following. First My Will is that all my just debts be regularly discharged. I give to my beloved Wife Mary Glapen all my personal estate of whatsoever kind or quality it may consist for the support of herself and my Children should all be kept together during their minority. I leave to my Wife Mary Glapen the use of all the Lands I am possessed of or entitled to during her natural life for the support of herself and my Children, and at the death of my Wife My Will is that my Estate be equally divided equally amongst my Children. I constitute and appoint my Friend William Innes Sole executor of the

Be it remembered that I John Barnhill of Chatham County, State of North Carolina, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in the following manner and form. First I order that all my Just debts be paid together with funeral Charges. I give and bequeath to my two Brothers Thomas Barnhill and William Barnhill the plantation that I now live on, including the piece of Land adjoining the same that I purchased of Canale and the monthly meeting and all my wearing apparel to each of them an equal share. And all the remainder of my Estate Real and personal. I order the same to be sold by my executors hereafter named, & the money arising therefrom, together with what money may be found after my decease, I give devise and dispose of the same in manner following. I give to my Sisters Ruth Winkham Rebecca Winkham, Ann Davis, Emory Dobson and Dinah Dobson, to each of them one dollar. And the sixth part of the remainder I give to the Children

of my Sister Hannah Mendenhall, viz. To each of them
 Male & Female an equal Share, and one seventh part I
 give to the Children of my Sister Ruth Kimball to each
 of them Male & Female an equal Share, and one seventh
 part I give to the Children of my Sister Rebecca Kimball
 to each of them Male and Female an equal Share.
 And the seventh part I give to the Children of my
 Sister Ann Davis, to each of them Male & Female an
 equal Share, and one seventh part I give to the Child-
 ren of my Sister Emily Hobson to each of them Male
 & Female an equal Share, and one seventh part I give
 to the Children of my Sister Dinah Hobson, to each
 of them Male and Female an equal Share.

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my
 Brother William Mearns and my trusty friend
 Solomon Dixon Executors of this my last Will and
 Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
