

50. Therein at the direction of my said Executors to be
divided into two equal parts that my said Executors
shall deliver to each of my Sons their share and shall be
left on each of my Daughters and their lawful heirs the
respective shares in such manner as that their respective
Husbands shall not have control over said distribution
share and that it shall not be liable for his debts or
trades until he give sufficient security for the same to
be appropriated to the support of my said Daughter
and their issue agreeable to the true intent and meaning
of this my will before the said division should be so
made I direct my said Executors after paying all my
lawful debts and funeral expenses to retain in their hands
fifty dollars each as a small consideration for their services
and trouble. And I declare this my last will being in
my perfect sense this 28th day February 1807. Afterby

God to make and ordain this my last will and testament
and revoking all others heretofore all other hitherto
made by me in manner and form following (fourth)
In the first place I give unto my son William Riddle
two hundred acres of Land wherein he now lies

2nd. I give unto my Son Charles Riddle one hundred 51.
acres of Land wherein he now lies also one other tract of
land at the head of the Riddle Creek Beginning at Mr. Sturt
Richards Corner then South with with the said line to the
old line of said tract of land - 3rd. I have given unto
my Son John Riddle one hundred and twenty five
acres of land wherein he formerly lived and my said Son
John has sold it to Merit Perkins which is his full
share of my Estate of every nature and kind which is my
will and desire. 4th. I have given unto my Daughter
Sibba Petty, one feather Bed and furniture and ten dollars
in Cash and some other Articles to a small amount which
is his and her Heirs full share of my Estate which is my
will and desire - 5th. My will and desire is that my Daughter
Stancy, Sally, Jane and Elizabeth Riddle each one have
one feather Bed and furniture a piece 6th. My will and
desire is that my Daughter Lydia Riddle shall have one
feather Bed and furniture to be raised by my wife Lydia
Riddle & Daughters in the way that their Beds were raised
by the family - 7th. My will and desire is that all my just
debts be paid out of the perishable part of my estate by my
Executors - 8. I loan to my loving wife Lydia Riddle
during her life or widowhood one hundred and eighty four
acres of Land wherein I now lie also eighty four acres
of land adjoining the above described land and joins
Brittany and Charles Riddle also I lend to my loving
wife as above all my personal Estate of every nature
and kind that is not already given away - also my will
and desire at the death or marriage of my wife Lydia
Riddle that the above loaned land and perishable
estate shall be sold and equally divided amongst my
five daughters (to wit) Stancy, Sally, Jane, Elizabeth and
Lydia Riddle also if either my five daughters before

52 they come to the age twenty one years should
we leave nothing than her other Sister to divide her
part equally between them - Lastly I constitute and ap-
point my two Sons, Britain and Charles Widdlewaite
executors of this my last Will and Testament this 8th day
of August A.D. 1821.

sold, to my beloved wife Mary during her natural life
or widowhood, my great object is to enable her rear my
dear little Children. 4^d I will and desire that as my children
become of age or marry that my Executors give to them
