Mahaly & Bellinton, Jenny & Bellinton & Charley & Bellinton  
also my Farming Utensils Household Kitchen Furniture, round  
for the use of the above named Children. Until my son  
Charley arrives at age then to be equally divided among  
the Four Children above named. The sale of some property  
will be indispensable to pay my just debts and the  
payment of some legacies in the above Will for this purpose  
I will take at discretion as soon after my death as  
may be proper such of my Stock or other personal Estates  
as my Executors think can be best spared.

Second August Term 1816  
by Joseph Foster

I John Williams of the County of Chatham attorney at law  
do make this my last Will and Testament as follows  
First. I direct that all my just debts be paid. Secondly. Give  
to my dearly beloved Wife Philadelphia all the plantation  
whereon I dwell, and all my Lands thereunto belonging or adjoining.  
Also the following negroes Old Cato, Lucy, a female,  
Jack, David, Jim, Scott, Sam and Caesar and Jimmy  
for her natural life; also I give her Four Pounds Sterling

to be chosen by herself. All the Furniture, Salter, Bells,  
Mutter and all my Hogs and Pork and Bacon to be for  
her own use and at her own disposal. Also I give to her  
my Household Kitchen Furniture for her natural life; my  
Double Chair, and Two Chair Seats to wit Grey, Red, Green  
also all my Wagons men, Horses, Saw, Carpenter Tools and  
Farming Utensils. Thirdly, I give unto my dearly beloved  
Daughter Sophia Lyons the following Negroes viz Dennis  
Julia, Anna and little Charity Child of Henry Barker  
Fourthly, I give to my son Charles Barker after the death  
of his brother Little Sam. Fifthly, I give unto my son  
John Barker, Abram & Jack after the death of his mother  
Sixtly, I give unto my C. W. Benjamin, Luis & Jim  
after the death of his mother. All the rest of my estate  
I will divide to settle or divide among all my Children &  
Grand Children. The grand children to take ~~the same~~  
which their Father would have taken if living except  
Big Sue and her Child, which I give to my son in  
law Joseph Henry Barker by parol: And which I give I  
hereby ratify and confirm. I appoint my dear wife  
Joseph Barker and James Barker my nephews, Executors of  
this my Will, hereby revoking all former Wills by me made.  
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this  
thirtieth day of Octr Eighteen hundred sixteen

In the name of God amen. Adams Kirby of the  
County of Chatham and State of North Carolina, being very  
weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be  
unto God. Calling unto mind the mortality of my body  
and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make  
and ordain this my last Will and Testament. that is to say  
Principally and first of all. I give and recommend my soul  
into the hands of Almighty God that gave it; and my body  
recommend to the Earth; and as touching such worldly  
estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life  
I give, demise and dispose of the same in the following manner  
and form. First. I leave to my wife Elizabeth my only  
beloved Wife during her lifetime the Grace of Anna whom  
I now take, Her Negroes namely, Sally, Necess and Charles  
and one third part of all my moveable property. The  
balance of Negroes excepting and after her deceased to be  
divided equally between all my Children now living unto  
the third line to her, and that after her decease I give to my  
son Wiley Kirby. Secondly I give unto my son Wright  
Kirby, one Negro Girl named Silla. Thirdly I give unto  
my son Isaac Kirby one Negro Man named James
