by the name of Ned. Then I give unto my son William
Allen who generally goes by the name of William Momack
the Negro Slave by the name of Sam. Then I leave unto
Susan Allen her life all the Stock of Horses, Cows,
Hogs and all the Household and Kitchen Furniture, &
Plantation Utensils with the crop that is now growing
and after her death to be equally divided between Robert
William and Elizabeth Allen. Then I give unto my
James Momack Five Shillings to be raised out of my
Estate. Then I give unto my son John Momack Five
Shillings to be raised out of my estate. Then I give unto
my Daughter Mary Pocham Five Shillings to be raised
out of my estate. Then I give unto my Daughter Nancy
Hatch Five Shillings to be raised out of my estate.
I do also ordain and appoint More Momack and
William Allen my executors to this my last Will &

Be it remembered that I John Barnhill of Chatham County, State of North Carolina, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in the following manner and form. First I order that all my Just debts be paid together with funeral Charges. I give and bequeath to my two Brothers Thomas Barnhill and William Barnhill the plantation that I now live on, including the piece of Land adjoining the same that I purchased of Canale and the monthly meeting and all my wearing apparel to each of them an equal share. And all the remainder of my Estate Real and personal. I order the same to be sold by my executors hereafter named, & the money arising therefrom, together with what money may be found after my decease, I give devise and dispose of the same in manner following. I give to my Sisters Ruth Winkham Rebecca Winkham, Ann Davis, Emory Dobson and Dinah Dobson, to each of them one dollar. And the sixth part of the remainder I give to the Children
