I Job Fackes of the State and county aforesaid, being of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following. That is to say:

Item, <sup>1<sup>st</sup></sup> That my executor herein after named shall provide for my body a decent burial suited to the wishes of my relations and friends and pay all funeral expenses together with all my just debts howsoever and to whomsoever owing out of the moneys, that may first come into his hand as a part of my estate Item <sup>2<sup>nd</sup></sup> I devise to my beloved wife Elizabeth all the property of every description that I may have at the time of my death after paying just debts and the necessary expenses as above named that is in the County of Chatham, if there should be any of my property left in the County of Graham that is not disposed of at the time of my death I devise it to my children And lastly I do constitute and appoint my friend Robert Lambert my sole and every part and clause thereof according to the true intent and meaning of the same hereby declared utterly void all former wills by me made
