William Hunter his heirs executors
and administrators and assigns to his
the said John S Hunter and their only prop-
~~erty~~ in law before forever nevertheless
I say that my nephew Mr Hunter and
father said John S Hunter shall hold
the property his lifetime for the use of
John S Hunter his son and after the
death of Mr Hunter father of John
Hunter the said John S Hunter shall
be full possession of the above named
property
