

In the name of God Amen, I John W Johnston, of the County of Chatham and State of North Carolina, being in feeble health of body but <sup>sound</sup> in mind and memory as usual do ordain this paper conting to be my last will and Testament in manner and form following to wit

Item first. I command my body to the dust to be decently buried at the discretion of my family and friends, and my soul to God who gave it

2<sup>d</sup> Item: As regards my earthly possessions which a kind Providence has bestowed upon me I wish to dispose of them in the following manner, First that all my just debts be punctually paid, 2<sup>d</sup> I loan to my loving wife Martha Johnston The Tract of Land where I now live together with all my household furniture farming utensils, Stock of horses, cows, sheep, hogs, &c. b. with the exception of such implements, articles or stock or property as I shall herein specify to be sold during her natural life, and after her decease I wish the land and premises, together with all the above named property remaining on hand at that time, to be sold, and the profits of the same to be equally divided among the legal heirs of my Estate, that is my children, or their heirs

3<sup>d</sup> I desire that my tract of land in the County

of Wake known as the Howell Olive  
Plant be sold by my Executor or  
Executor hereafter named.

4<sup>th</sup> I also desire that my Stallion horse, Bill,  
be sold, also my Young Gelding, Salem,  
4 years old, also one Yoke of Oxen,  
log Cart and Chain the Land and  
~~and~~ property that I have specified to be sold  
~~and~~ profits arising therefrom, after paying  
my just debts, I wish to be equally divided  
among my children and my wife to have  
a child's portion of the same. The foregoing  
will shows the manner in which I desire to  
dispose of my property and I hereby constitute  
~~and~~ appoint my loving wife Martha  
Johnston my Executor, to my last will and  
revoking all other wills by me made  
and acknowledging this and this only to  
be my last will and Testament in manner  
and form above stated. In witness I the  
said John W Johnston doth hereunto set  
my hand and seal this the Twenty ninth day  
of April one thousand eight hundred and fifty  
seven

The execution of the foregoing last will and Testament of John  
W Johnston was then duly proven in open Court by the  
oath of Dempsey Johnson a subscribing witness thereto and ordered  
to be recorded whereupon Martha Johnston the  
named Executor therein named appeared in open Court  
and was duly qualified as such -

In the name of God Amen. I Thomas Workman, of  
the County of Chatham and State of North Carolina  
being of sound mind and memory, and Considering  
the uncertainty of this frail and transitory life  
do therefore, ordain, Publish, and declare this to be  
my last Will and Testament. That is to say first  
after all lawfull debts are paid and discharged  
The residue of my estate real and personal I give  
bequeath and dispose of as follows to wit: To my  
son Thomas Workman Forty acres of land where  
he now lives, begining at the white oak Spring running  
South between the other two springs opposite Sorn Knaps  
of woods thence West to the Knaps, thence South  
far enough to get the forty acres by coming east  
to John Strouds line, to him and his heirs forever  
to my daughter Sally Brown, and her lawfull  
heirs Forty acres of land, begining at the Reptile  
Spring running up the hollow to the line of the  
heirs of Martha Patterson to a hickory blowed up  
thence North to a white oak thence East far enough  
to get the forty acres by running South to Samuel  
Baldwins line, thence West course back to the Reptile  
Spring. The balance of this tract I also give  
to my daughter Sally her lifetime should she  
die without a lawfull heir of her body, then what  
I have willed to her, is to be equally divided between  
my son Thomas Workman, Patsey Lewis, Silvy  
Williams and Elizabeth Hargraves, heirs, to them  
and their heirs forever, to my daughter Patsey  
and the lawful heirs of her body a portion of  
land joining Samuel Baldwin begining at his  
corner running South to a hickory corner  
thence ~~south~~ to a black oak thence North  
opposite Baldwin corner, thence West
