In the name of God Amen!

I John McBane of the County
of Chatham and State of North Carolina, do make
ordain, publish and declare this my last will
and testament in the manner following, first
revoking all other wills by me heretofore made.

Imprimis it is my will and desire that my
body be decently buried and all my just debts
punctually paid and that the remaining part
of my property be disposed of in the following
manner.

Item, I give and bequeath to my four grandsons,
John M. Hill, Alexander H. Hill, Frederick
A. Hill and Samuel Hill the whole of my land-
ed estate all lying in the County of Chatham
consisting of several separate tracts, including in
the whole about nineteen hundred and forty
five acres, as will appear from deeds in my
possession, to be equally divided amongst
them, these having reference both to quantity and
quality, as soon after my death as my Executors
may think proper, which division shall be by
deed and shall vest in each of the above named
grandsons a good and sufficient title in fee
simple for their several shares of said land, for
ever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my four granddaughters,
Mary Julia Hill, Sarah Lois Hill, Eliza H. Hill
& Maria Wallis Hill, seven hundred & fifty dollars
in cash, each or three thousand dollars to be equal-
ly divided amongst them, as soon as my Executors
can make it out of what money may be on
hand at my death, of money due me, or the
proceeds of sales of such part of my estate as I may
herein direct to be sold.

Item, I give and bequeath, all my negroes at
the time of my death, including those which Thor Hill
had in his possession, during his life time, to the
before named Eight grand children, to be divided
amongst them as soon as my Executors may think
proper after my death, so that each one shall have a

lot, equal in value as near as well can be,

Item I give, ^{obsequath} to my nephew James Mebane sen^r of Orange my silver watch.

Item, I give & bequeath to my nephew Doctor John A. Mebane of Greensboro, my silver hilted sword, it being the first sword taken from the British in North Carolina during the revolutionary war, by my brother Col. Robert Mebane

Item, it is my will and I do hereby direct my executors as soon as may be proper after my death to sell at publick sale, on a credit of twelve months, the whole of my property of every description, not herein bequeathed, and to divide whatever may remain of the proceeds of such sales, after paying my debts &c before named legacies, equally amongst my eight grandchildren.

I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my nephews James Mebane sen^r of Orange & Doctor John A. Mebane of Guilford, executors of this my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal, this 31st day of May 1834.
