be recorded. Whereupon William Hinshaw saw one of the  
executors herein named appeared in open Court  
& was qualified Sept 1<sup>st</sup> A.D. 1840 86

State of North Carolina Chatham County  
I John Watson of the county & state aforesaid being  
weak in body though in sound and perfect mind &  
memory do this day make & ordain this my last  
Will & Testament (So witt) I in the first place bequeath  
my soul to God who gave it & my body to be buried  
in decent Christian burial, secondly I give & bequeath  
unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Watson during her  
natural life time the following property that is to say  
I give & bequeath unto her all the land I may die  
possessed of on the north side of Rick Creek belonging  
to what I call the James Brooks tract also one  
small acre that I bought of Samuel Brooks  
whereon my dwelling house stands together

with all appurtenances mines minerals & all  
immunities whatsoever I also give unto my beloved  
wife during her natural life the following negro  
property namely a negro man called Peter and a negro  
woman called Sarah & her five children which she  
now has namely Eliza & a son now. Daniel Tom  
eldest and also all the children she may have  
from this time henceforth as long as my wife  
Elizabeth Watson shall live I also give & bequeath  
unto my wife Elizabeth Watson two thirds of my stock  
of cattle one half of my stock of sheep & one half of  
my stock of hogs and one half of my cropland  
& may die possessed of and all my household  
and kitchen furniture these last bequeathed unto  
the stock of cattle the stock of sheep the stock of  
hogs & the house hold & kitchen furniture & also  
liberty to bequeath in her own way and also one  
half of my stock of horses I bequeath unto her  
to dispose of in her own way & also my road hogs  
& hens I bequeath unto my wife Elizabeth Watson  
to dispose of in her own way and also I bequeath  
unto my wife Elizabeth Watson one negro child  
& known by the name of Melly to have & to hold  
as her own right & property until my son Benjamin  
Watson is Twenty one years of age my desire is that  
this girl Melly shall then be returned to my other  
stock of negroes for the benefit of my children  
that is the other stock of negroes which is not  
bequeathed & also I give and bequeath  
unto my wife Elizabeth whatever provision  
& have on hand for my family that I do

proposed of this attorney will and desire that the land  
which I may die possessed of which hath not  
been before bequeathed shall be equally divided  
between my son Benjamin Watson and William  
Watson as soon as my son Benjamin Watson  
arrives at the age of Twenty one years this also my  
will and desire that the lands which my son  
Benjamin Watson & my son William Watson  
may fall heir to shall be valued and that my several  
daughters namely Mary Watson Emily Watson &  
Eliza Lawrence Watson have out of my estate of  
negroes which have not yet been bequeathed the same  
amount that my son Benjamin Watson & my son  
William Watson has had in lands the negroes first  
being valued then the balance of the negroes which  
may remain belonging to my estate to be equally  
divided between my several children namely  
Benjamin Watson Mary Watson William Watson  
Emily Watson Eliza Watson & James Ethelinda  
Watson this also my will & desire that the lands  
which I have bequeathed to my wife Elizabeth Watson  
during her life time shall be after her death the property  
of my son James Ethelinda Watson to have & to hold  
during his natural life & also I also appoint my  
writing friends Andrew Headon & William Mackney  
executors of this my last will & testament in witness  
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed  
my seal this 5<sup>th</sup> Sept 1840
