son Joseph Rose and also to pay William C. Stedman the debt due  
him next in turn to Robert Marsh and all others of his creditors  
received in proportion to their respective demands provided  
there should be a balance of land legacy my Executor and trustee  
to put to interest for the use of the heirs of Joseph Rose —  
The crop that is now growing I leave at the discretion of my  
Executor to dispose of as they may think best —  
I appoint John Peoples and William C. Stedman my friends  
to be my Executors — signed sealed in the presence of us  
in this year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and  
twenty seven April 29<sup>th</sup>  
Cornelius Wamblee <sup>3</sup> John Rose  
Henry Bell <sup>3</sup> Broad at May 1<sup>st</sup> 1827 —

I Joseph Branson of Chatham County on N. Carolina do  
make & publish this my last Will & Testament hereby revoking  
all former Will by me made First I give unto my wife  
Sarah Branson one house of the first choice also two  
cows first choice, two head of sheep first choice also two  
heads of hogs first choice six peccoles plates & two delph plates  
& one set tea cups & saucers, six bowls & two sets of knives  
and forks & two delph pitchers, six Iron spoons, & one five  
gallon iron pot & one three gallon Pot Dutch oven two  
flat Irons & one washing tub two water pails, two Beds  
& furniture, one large Walnut table & one small desk —  
six chairs & also the East end of the House which I now  
live in one fourth of all the grain & fodder raised on the plantation  
where I now live it also one case of drawers, and one chest  
one three gallon blue jugs and two gallon blue Jugs & at  
the death of my wife, or separation after we have agreed to  
be sold & equally divided among them, thus daughters namely  
Mary, Cornelia Branson and Elizabeth Coffin & Dorothy

four children to count as one namely Sarah Branson  
Elizabeth and Dorothy Waller I have given unto my son John  
Branson I gave unto my son Levi Branson the tract of land  
I now live on with a Horse two cows two head of sheep I gave  
unto my daughter Mary Branson one horse worth eighty  
dollars two cows two head of sheep one Bed & furniture one  
case of drawers one washing tub two water pails the four gallon  
iron pot one still the Gallon pot one Dutch oven two flat  
Iron's six pewter plates six delph plates one set of knives  
and forks the set of tea cups & saucers one set of tea spoons  
one small spring wheel one seal one Churn & a half dozen  
Chairs other beds like is to have what she has made within  
her self & also give unto my daughter Cornelia Branson  
one house worth eighty dollars saddle & Bridle two cows  
two sheep one bed & furniture one case of drawers one  
four Gallon iron pot one still the Gallon pot two flat  
iron's one iron washing tub two water pails six pewter  
plates six delph plates one set of iron spoons one set of tea cups  
& saucers six spoons one set of knives & forks one small spring  
wheel one half dozen Chairs one seal one Churn Mary Branson  
Branson is to have what they have made within themselves also the  
rest of my land and all other of my property if any to be sold  
and divided equally amongst my three daughters Dorothy Waller, four chil-  
dren to count as one Mary Cornelia Branson & Elizabeth Coffin I consti-  
tute and appoint my two sons John Levi Branson my Executor to this my last  
will & testament in testimony whereof I Joseph Branson the said testator  
have signed & published & declared the foregoing to be my last will & leg-  
acy while in my sound & perfect mind testimony March 28<sup>th</sup> A.D. 1827  
Witness my hand & seal here is the present Joseph Branson <sup>Seal</sup>  
of the 2<sup>d</sup> of April 1827
