In the name of God amen. I Joseph Glapon of the County of Chatham and State of North Carolina being very sick but of sound mind and memory. Having calling to mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following. First My Will is that all my just debts be regularly discharged. I give to my beloved Wife Mary Glapon all my personal estate of whatsoever kind or quality it may consist for the support of herself and my Children should all be kept together during their minority. I leave to my Wife Mary Glapon the use of all the Lands I am possessed of or entitled to during her natural life for the support of herself and my Children, and at the death of my Wife My Will is that my Estate be equally divided equally amongst my Children. I constitute and appoint my Friend William Innes Sole executor of the

And all the remainder of my Estate Real and personal. I order the same to be sold by my executors hereafter named, & the money arising therefrom, together with what money may be found after my decease, I give devise and dispose of the same in manner following. I give to my Sisters Ruth Winkham Rebecca Winkham, Ann Davis, Emory Dobson and Dinah Dobson, to each of them one dollar. And the Sixth part of the remainder I give to the Children
