

Be it remembered that Joseph Kemp of the County of Sullivan
and state of North Carolina being yet advanced in years but of
sound and perfect mind and memory, calling to mind the mortality
of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to
die, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in the
following manner and form, First I order that all my just debts
be paid together with my funeral charges

First I devise to my daughter Susannah one cow four head
of sheep two head of hogs my starret Pewter dish my lame one
cockeling and my riding chair and hamper all the above articles upon
honor debt which I owe her which amounts to twenty dollars also
give her the new part of my house together with a lot of land
bounded as follows to wit beginning at the south ^{east} corner of said house
thence running nearly south to a willow tree on the Spring branch
thence down the branch to a white oak at the mouth of said
branch thence running up the brook to a pine in John Teters
line thence with said line east to the northeast corner of said house
containing two acres more or less also give her timber off my
part of my land for ratis to fence her land and to keep the premises
repair all firewood and water.

Second of will and bequeath to my son John the sum of two dollars;
Third I will and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Batal the sum
of two dollars ~~which~~ with what I have already given her

Fourth I give and devise to my son Joseph the sum of two
dollars Fifth I give and devise to my son Joshua four head of sheep
my wagon and hind gear my large steel yard, my iron
scamp, scaving knife and nail hammer all my copper tools
one pair of sheep shears and one iron tooth hammer.

Sixth I will and devise to my daughter Phebe one ~~any~~

Seventh I will and devise to my son Jacob the rest of cattle
four head of sheep one pitchfork and four other one plow and
iron, one hoe one mattock one ax, two horseshoes, one pair of iron
chains and six yards my rifle gun and mounted one pair of large
fine dogs, I also give and devise to my said son Jacob that part of the
land which I now live on which lies on the west side of the branch
belonging to the north fork of Rocky River joining his own land
and the lands of Joseph Heppner William Johnson and John
Barker except a lot of land containing about two acres which
I give to my grandson Joseph Kemp which has planted part
thereof in fruit trees and past meadow and bounded on the east
side thereof by the branch and on the other sides by his uncle John's
land. Also give to my said son Jacob all my blacksmith tools,
Eight I give and bequeath to my grandson John Barker the sum
of two dollars; Ninth I will and devise to my grand daughter
Susannah Barker one young heifer one large peacock soon
which formerly belonged to my sister Prudence Kemp one chick-
en, two head of sheep one steel fork and one hit heifer
Tenth I will and devise to Daniel Kemp my old part of the
house during her widowhood and after her death to my grandson
Joseph Kemp son my son Joseph Kemp also give and devise
to my said grandson Joseph all my land lying on the east
side of the said north fork of rocky river, excepting the lot of
land which I have already willed to my daughter Susannah,
part of which is known by the name of Kimington's old place
joining the land of John Barker Joseph Heppner David Lindley
John Johnson the widow Johnson Samuel Hayes and his wife
Isabella. I give to Sophia Kemp the full privilege and use of
of said land until my grandson Joseph comes to the age of
maturity. I also give and devise to my said grand son Joseph
one long chain one tooked by one mattock one drawing knife
my little fine dog one hot rack, two batters . . .

the darning needle, knife one graining knife my small Steel yard
one back plane one front edge, I give and devise the said Grand
and the articles mentioned above to my said Grand son Joseph on
conditions that he pays the yearly fee of the board which I have
allotted to him and also the sum of twenty dollars to his four sisters
when they come of age (four), five dollars to Ruth five dollars to
Wetmet five dollars to Rachel and five dollars to Anna,
I also will and devise to my said daughter Susannah all the
articles of household and kitchen furniture which has not
been mentioned before in this will to be at her disposal
And Lastly I nominate constable and appoint my two
sons John and Joshua Kemp executors to this my last will and
testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
seal This 25th day of the fifth month 1830
