

State of North Carolina Chatham County March the ninth
 day Eighteen Hundred Thirty two, I Joseph Kemp being
 weak in body but perfect mind & memory do make and
 ordain this my last will & Testament in manner and
 form as follows - First my body to be buried decently at
 the discretion of my executors here after named and
 all my just debts & order to be paid give and dispose
 the remaining part of my Estate in manner and form
 as follows that is to say in primis I leave and bequeath
 unto my loving wife Dorches Kemp my Clock Beams
 and her bed and furniture and the privilege of the daily
 house and Kitchen and furniture and her maintenance
 on the land during life or widowhood I leave and bequeath
 to my two sons Jape Kemp and John Kemp
 my lands to be equally divided between them - If they
 can't agree between themselves they must choose men
 to divide it between them, and I also leave to my two
 sons Jape & John my wagons and gear and all my
 farming tools and Blacksmith tools & I leave to my son
 Jape the horse that he now claims and the saddle that
 he claims also and his gun and one bed and furniture
 and two sows and pigs that he now claims
 And I leave and to my daughter Melinda Kemp the
 colt that she now claims and her bed and furniture
 and chest and two tables & big wheel and a sow
 & pigs & the wren that she now claims on the droppor -
 Also I give & bequeath to my daughter Margaret Kemp one
 bed & furniture and one chest and her claim of the wren
 on the droppor - And I leave and bequeath to my
 son John Kemp one young Horse called Dick one bed
 and furniture and my rifle gun and his sow & pigs
 that he now claims. And I leave and bequeath to
 my daughter Anna Kemp one bed & furniture -
 And all the balance of my stock horses cattle hogs &c &c
 that is not above mentioned I leave to my wife Dorches
 for the use of the family - And my two sons Jape & John
 to pay my daughter Melinda twenty dollars and my
 daughter Margaret Thirtieth dollars and my daughter Anna
 Thirtieth dollars when they become of age - And I hereby
 appoint my two Brothers Joshua Kemp and Job Kemp

My Executors this my last will & testament hereby revoking and making void all former wills and legacies by me made and declaring this to be my last will & testament in writing whereunto I set my hand and seal
