Mann the fourth lot of lands beginning at a clearing on a Hawthorn spring branch thence down the various corners of the branch to a white oak on a branch at the old finds something like twenty poles from the mouth of the spring branch thence also from the white oak to a white oak on dry creek near the old finds below the mouth of leave neck spring branch thence up the various corners of the creek to a dog woods thence south with leave neck line to a red oak. Thence south to a clearing the first station which is to be his or his ay or assigns forever. I also give him a horse by the name of Jo and bridle and saddle - I also give to my son Garret B. Mann the fourth lot of lands beginning at the above named white oak corner running down the said spring branch to the creek thence down the various corners of the creek to have since thence up the various corners of the creek to a white oak leave neck corner thence west on his line to Dry Creek thence up the various corners of Dry Creek to a white oak thence south with Lef. B. lot to the first station which is to be his or his ay or assigns forever. he is also to have a horse worth seventy five dollars and a bridle and saddle when he is become of age I also give and bequeath to my beloved wife Charlotte all my hand tract of lands containing two hundred and eighty five acres during her life time and then to be equally divided between Linai of Mann Temperance J. Mann Charlotte A. Mann. Edmund A. Mann Elizabeth B. Mann Mary A. Mann. Thence ay and assigns forever. I also give to my daughter Linai one black walnut dining room table, one dining table on bed and furniture and black walnut bedstead. I also give my daughter Temperance one dining table

black walnut on bed and furniture and one bedstead. I also give to my daughter Charlotte one small mahogany folding table one slab one bed and furniture and one poplar bedstead. I also give to my son Edmund fifty acres of land lying on the prime hill adjoining the lands of Lef. B. Mann and J. Mann. I also give to my son Lef. B. Mann one horse worth seventy five dollars and bridle and saddle when he is become of age. I also give to my wife Charlotte one wagon and gear one man mares fly wheels all my cow hogs and sheep and all my household and kitchen furniture that has not been named above and all my farming utensils. I also leave her all my money and notes and accounts -

Lastly, I do hereby constitute my loving wife Charlotte and my son Lef. B. Mann my sole Executors and Administrators to this my last will and Testament. Given under my hand and seal at my home at Dry Creek this the 6th of January 1842
