Mann the second lot of lands beginning at a ellum on a Hawthorn spring branch thence down the various courses of the branch to a white oak on sd branch at the old fence something like twenty poles from the mouth of the spring branch thence also from the white oak to a white oak on dry creek near the old fence below the mouth of leave neck spring branch thence up the various courses of the creek to a dog wood thence south with leave neck line to a red oak unless south to a ellum the first station which is to be his or his ay or assigns forever. I also give him a horse by the name of Jo and hille and saddle - I also give to my son James S. Mann the fourth lot of lands beginning at the above named white oak corner running down the said spring branch to the creek thence down the various courses of the creek to a haw sinner thence up the various courses of the creek to a white oak leave neck corner thence west on his line to dry creek thence up the various courses of the creek to a white oak thence south with Lefo's lot to the first station which is to be his or his ay or assigns forever. he is also to have a horse worth seventy five dollars and a hille and saddle when hea become of age I also give and bequeath to my beloved wife Charlotte all my bound tract of lands containing two hundred and eighty five acres during her life time and then to be equally divided between Linai of Mann Temperance J. Mann Charlotte A. Mann. John W. C. Mann Elizabeth B. Mann Mary of Mann. Ther ay and assigns forever. I also give to my daughter Linai one black walnut chis rottum drawer and dining table one bed and furniture and black walnut hille I also give my daughter Temperance one folding table

black walnut one bed and furniture and Carlton bedstead I also give to my daughter Charlotte one small mahogany folding table one slab one bed and furniture and one poplar bedstead I also give to my son John W. C. Mann fifty acres of land lying on the prime hill adjoining the lands of Alpe West and Wm. A. Hardin hea is to have one horse worth seventy five dollars and hille and saddle when hea become of age I also give him my rifle gun I also give my daughter Elizabeth one walnut stand of drawers - I also give my daughter Mary ten dollars in money when shea be come of age I also give to my wife Charlotte one wagon and gear one man named Fly and all my cow hay and sheep and all my household and kitchen furniture that has not bin named about aches all my farming utensils I also leave her all my money and notes and a c account - Lastly I do hereby constitute my loving wife Charlotte and my son Lefo. C. Mann my sole Executors and Administrators to this my last will and Testament - Given under my hand and seal at my home at Dry Creek this the 6 of January 1842
