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appoint this my last Will and Testament VVH principally in a first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my Successors to the earth to be buried in a vault found at the direction of my Executors W. And as touching such untold goods and estate which with it, has pleased God to bless me with in this life, I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form. to wit. I give my dear Mary Rogers a small parcel of Land lying on the South side of Dry Creek bounded on the West and North by her own land and on the East on South by Benjamin Harris Son. I leave my daughter Polly Perry a negro known by the name of Jane to her and her heirs forever. I leave to my beloved Wife Francis by name my Land where I now live together with all my plantation Tools of any kind my House, Barn, Hogs and Sheep and all my Negroes Household and Kitchen Furniture of any description during her mortal life, and at her death to be divided after the following manner to wit. I leave my son James the Land where I now live together with a small tract or parcel of Land lying on both sides of Dry Creek bounded on the North by Joseph T. Tilton's line joining Henry Cooks and Benjamin Harris Son on the South and the balance of the property to be equally divided amongst my Children. I leave my son James Rogers

my whole and sole Executor to this my last Will and
