leave unto my son William during life the balance of my estate to be
kept together until my son William is twenty years
of age, then he shall be entitled to draw an equal part
of all such estate and when my daughter Patsy shall
arrive to the age of twenty years, shall be entitled to draw
her proportionable part of the balance of all such estate
the rest of such estate to be kept together until my son
Thomas becomes of age, then the balance to be equally
divided between himself and my daughter Maria
should either of my daughter Mary before they are
entitled to draw their proportionable part. I request that
their shall be lent to them, such a part as my Executors
shall think proper until such time as they are entitled
to a division. My Land I leave with and to the benefit of
my Wife and two sons, William and Thomas, and at my
Wife's death to be equally divided between said William
and Thomas, the five Negroes, namely Lewis, Frank,
Amy, Charity and Lydia, and such other property
as I leave unto my Wife at her death to be equally divided
